After the flood, Almighty God made a covenant with Noah and all living creatures. His sign of this covenant is the rainbow that never again will a flood destroy all mortal beings. One of the tragedies and outrages of our present day is that many people do not realize the rainbow is a covenant sign of God, and only know the rainbow as a flag to represent groups that advocate intrinsically disordered sin. Many of the symbolism of Noah and the flood point to their fulfillment in Our Lord and His Catholic Church.

The New Covenant through Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, restores all to communion with God by reconciling us to God through the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. We renew this covenant at every Mass as we are made present at His suffering, death and resurrection and we accept His covenant by receiving Christ's Body and Blood.

The New Covenant binds together God to His people with the promise of eternal life. Christ tells us how we participate in the covenant: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

If we want salvation and a true relationship with Our Divine Savior, Our Lord tells us today that the first step is repentance from sin. The primary means of turning away from sin and turning to God is the Sacrament of

Reconciliation, where we confess our sins to Almighty God and receive absolution. This Lent in particular, let us renew our acceptance of this great covenant by receiving His Body and Blood and renewing our commitment to repent, and believe in the Gospel.

Florida District – De Soto Province Exemplification March 9, 2024, St. Frances Cabrini Catholic Church, Parrish, FL Fourth Degree Exemplification Instructions

The next live exemplification for the Florida District of the De Soto Province will be on Saturday, March 9, at St. Frances Cabrini Catholic Church 12001 69th St E Parrish, FL 34219 The ceremony will start at noon. There will also be a ladies' tea at noon. The Exemplification opens with registration at 9 a.m., followed by Mass at St. Frances. The antechamber opens at 10 a.m., and will include instructions plus the recitation of the Patriotic Rosary in the anteroom to get candidates into the proper frame of mind for the Patriotic Degree. The ceremony will begin at noon, and will be followed by a banquet at 3 p.m.

The candidate fee is \$90, including banquet, and the fee for a Priest is \$45. The banquet fee for family, friends and observers is \$50. The ladies' tea will be \$10.

3 p.m.: Exemplification Banquet

Assemblies are required to send in a downloaded copy of the registration form (please do not write on the original), degree certificate, signed dress code letter, signed Form 4 (all four copies for each candidate) and check. To access the forms required you can click on the links below or go to Fourth Degree Forms (floridakofc.org) to download the forms. Please note the dress code for the exemplification. While tuxedos are no longer mandatory, candidates must wear a dark suit (not brown!) and black dress shoes. Candidates are encouraged to write the number of their new assembly on the back of their KofC membership card.
