The Color Corps of 3296 and 2722 continue to respond collaboratively when asked to participate in providing an Honor Guard for Funerals of Brothers and Sir Knights and family members in addition to other ceremonies throughout the year. Assembly 3296 has added two color corps members this past fraternal year. Both assemblies continue to recruit 4th degree members into the Color Corp.

Our community project of securing clothes for the handicapped veterans and

their families as well as Christmas gift packages for the hospitalized or nursing home veterans in Gainesville.

We continue to pray for those on our sick and deceased list each month. Our Assembly is fortunate to have a Deacon who provides us thoughts for our careful consideration as we travel on our faith journey.

St. Sister Faustina and the Souls in Purgatory

In 1926, St. Sister Faustina asked the Lord one night for whom she should pray. Jesus told her that on the following night, He would let her know. The next night, she saw her Guardian Angel. He took her to "a misty place full of fire in which there was a great crowd of suffering souls." "They were praying fervently," writes St. Faustina in her Diary, "but to no avail, for themselves; only we can come to their aid." She asked what their greatest suffering was, and in one voice they answered her that their greatest torment was longing for God.

Then St. Sister Faustina saw Our Lady visiting the souls in Purgatory and bringing them refreshment. After that, her Guardian Angel led her out again.

"Since that time, I am in closer communion with the suffering souls," she writes.

As St. Sister Faustina saw in her vision, the souls in Purgatory cannot pray for themselves. In God's mysterious plan, these poor souls needed the prayers of the faithful on earth in order to be freed from her suffering. In the same way, all of the souls in Purgatory at this moment desperately need our prayers, for no matter how hard they pray for themselves, their own prayers won't help them.

Ours will. Even though the souls in Purgatory cannot pray for themselves, they can pray for others. And in a beautiful reciprocal act of mercy, if we pray for them,

they can and will pray for us. The Catechism (958) says that "Our prayer for them is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective." Our prayers for them are the key that unlocks their prayers for us!

An army of prayer warriors is waiting for us in Purgatory. When we pray for them, we can then ask them to intercede for us, so that we may receive the great blessing of their prayers in return. Every single prayer, big or small, for the souls in Purgatory helps them. Even if a prayer is offered for someone who has already reached heaven, then that prayer will be applied to another soul. No prayer is ever wasted. No act of love for the holy souls goes unanswered. No offering will fail to bring comfort, consolation, and the radiance of heaven to these dear suffering souls. Now is the time to pray for our deceased family and friends who may be in Purgatory.
