Sir Knights and the Corporal Acts of Mercy
Traditionally, the Corporal Acts of Mercy are defined as:

Feeding the hungry
Giving drink to the thirsty
Clothing the naked
Sheltering the homeless
Visiting the sick
Visiting the imprisoned
Burying the dead.

Of these, six come directly from the Gospel of Matthew in Chapter 25 where Our Lord separates the sheep from the goats. The only one not listed in Matthew's Judgment scene is the last one—burying the dead. But this one is added to the list in deference to the body being the "temple of the Holy Spirit."

As members of Assembly 3296, the Sir Knights have practiced the Corporal Acts of Mercy since the inception of the assembly. Your contributions to the parish and local community are important and you should feel proud of the good you have accomplished.

One Corporal Act of Mercy we do is normally individually. Often, we are called to visit a friend or loved one in a nursing home or in the hospital. As Catholic men and Sir Knights, I ask you to consider bringing Christ's love and mercy to those you visit. I have three suggestions on how to do this:

Speak of God's love and mercy. Sometimes we are hesitant to do this, either because we think we don't have the spiritual training or we don't know what to say. A priest told me once just think if you were laying in the bed, what message of God's love would you want to hear. Then just use those words.

Do they need a priest to visit? Many family members with a loved one who is ill or in distress are so worried about the physical needs that they forget about the spiritual needs. You be the one to help with this.

End your visit with a prayer. It can be an Our Father or one you make up for the situation. Show that you are more than a friend or relative. You are their brother in the Body of Christ. May Almighty God continue to bless this Assembly and the Sir Knights as they continue to perform their Corporal Acts of Mercy.

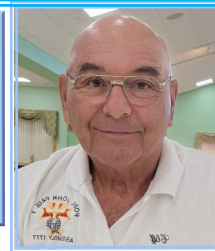
Initial planning has started for a St Joseph Day Feast on March 18, 2023. Anyone wishing to assist in the planning is welcome.
