Faithful Friar's Message



The season of Lent was something I always dreaded. I think it was due to the fact that I found it hard to find something meaningful to give up during this season. I've given up dessert and candy, but that doesn't seem to have much meaning for me as an adult. I've done fasting more recently. I choose not to eat a meal one day each week. That has helped, but a few years ago I came upon the following suggestions that might make Lent more meaningful for you and me.

You could fast from <u>discouragement</u> by writing down your blessings, talents and good qualities and then bringing that to prayer. You could fast from <u>harsh words</u> by saying something kind to someone and then praying for them if they are rude to you. Fast from <u>complaining</u> by not grumbling to others or offering up your daily disappointments. Fast from <u>self-centeredness</u> by being more attentive to those around you. Send a card to someone who has lost a loved one. Call someone in need. Fast from <u>ill-temper</u> by smiling at those you meet today.

Fasting can also be done for things instead of just from things. Consider fasting for your <u>family</u> by doing one thing that you find difficult to do. Fast for your <u>relatives</u> by skipping a meal and then praying during that time for them. I will fast for <u>victims of war</u> and for those who must fight them by reading scripture for 10 minutes and praying for their safety. You can fast from coffee or soda today and pray for those who are <u>victims of alcoholism or drug abuse</u>. In the scriptures Isaiah the Prophet says that God doesn't care for our fasting if it doesn't change our hearts to free the oppressed, lifting the burdens of the poor, and changing systems. Make coming to the FAITH Action on March 30th part of your Lenten observance to do justice, and then the Lord will be pleased with your fasting.

If you have found Lent difficult as I have, maybe these suggestions can help. May God draw us closer to Himself this Lent so that we might be holy people when Easter comes.
