PGK Charlie Schramm sees 4955's great potential

On July 6, I had my first opportunity to speak with Charles Schramm since the council's 50th Anniversary, nearly 15 years earlier, and it was a most enjoyable and friendly chat!

Charlie joined 50 years ago this year, and is currently 4955's earliest surviving Grand Knight (1978-1979).

Although our archives include the scrapbook chronicling his year as Grand Knight, I wanted to ask for insights and observations that may serve to inspire the current generation of Knights and leadership.

I asked him for some of the highlights from the time:

"Well, we transferred the old pews from St. Elizabeth into San Isidro. I had to bring along 5-gallon gas containers because this was during the Energy Crisis.

"I am also very proud of the awards we won at the State Convention."

Later, as District Deputy, he was the first to argue the need for Council 5235 to merge back into 4955. It would by 1994.

I observed how the photos not only showed a variety of activities, but how everyone seemed to have great fun. Charlie responded: "I like to work. No one was told what to do, no

one grumbled. We just got it done.

"The people were good. When someone hollered for help, we'd do it. As tired as we may have been after finishing one event, we all stayed until set-up was complete for the next day's event. [I too remember that situation many times!].

"You'd surround yourself with inspirational people, but people who also had a good

sense of humor ... nothing too offensive!

"One time I rode my motorcycle inside the hall with PGK Eddie Millar in the backseat. Not everyone appreciated that one (laughs). Another time, I and some others arrived at the annual Past Grand Knight Dinner/Dance from the back of PGK Bob Sorrelle's old dump truck!"

Charlie lives surrounded by the beauty of the Georgia mountains, and he remains active in numerous ways. He still enjoys riding his motorcycle. He still assists at his parish, including helping widows with various needs.

"I won't refuse anything unless I can't do it. That makes me happy."

He still sets-up the large tents for the annual parish festival. ["A job that no one else wants to do. And I'm 84. I don't know how much longer I can continue doing that. I'm concerned that the younger generation just doesn't want to get involved like they used to be. They don't seem to realize what they're missing by not going beyond themselves."]

I told Charlie I'd continue to pray for his strength, health and happiness. We both look forward to more phone

Heroes Wanted

(Editor's note: **Respect Life Director Steve Foley** made this presentation at the July membership meeting.)

When my son was a small child, I loved to take him to St. Elizabeth of Hungary for the Children's Sunday Mass with Father Glorie.

He would invite the children up to the altar and his homily was to them.

At the time, I was going through a divorce and Sundays were my visitation days. One Sunday, the children were asked to come up for their homily and were asked, "Who is your Hero?"

All the kids eagerly raised their hands and one-by-one replied with Superman, Ninja Turtles, Simba, Barney, etc.

When it came to my son, I was very apprehensive as to his answer, especially due to my ongoing bitter battle of the divorce. My son didn't hesitate by saying emphatically "MY DADDY."

The priest and congregation rustled a little, looking for this proud "HERO" sitting in the front row of the church.

This was the <u>PROUDEST</u> <u>MOMENT OF MY LIFE</u> and it was impossible to hold back a tear or two.

Ever since that day, I strived to be the HERO that my son would always be able to look up to.

A long time has passed. Life with my son has changed a bit. That story is reserved for another day, but it hasn't changed my resolve to remain that HERO my son believed me to be.

You see, men should not be measured by their machismo, power, aggression, greed, or coarseness in language. That is the "Tough Guy Hero" that is usually depicted in the movies.

Heroes are "Men of VIRTUE." Those of high moral value who will fight for a cause, the poor, the preborn and the innocent. They do not play politics. They are not indecisive or stubborn. They are true leaders.

A HERO is a MAN who will stand for what is RIGHT, even if he stands ALONE. One who has the qualities of strength, courage, resilience, discipline, and integrity.

A respectful man is one who shows empathy, compassion and accountability



-- someone who is humble and gives ALL to the glory to God.

Men who not only pray but actually put those prayers into ACTION.

Please, don't think I am trying to describe me with all the above. Oh NO, I am FAR from that.

Jesus Christ was the only person who could fit that description and He is "MY HERO" and role model.

OK, I gave you my #1 Hero, Who is your HERO?

Here are just a few my local examples.

Frank Laverty told me about his order of the Franciscans. It takes a REAL HERO to visit a hospital to give support and minister to Patients dying with AIDs. Frank, YOU are my Hero.

What Mike Charles did with the Homeless Goody Bags was fantastic. Mike, You are my HERO.

The SUPER HERO not only hands the bag to the homeless, but tries to engage, ask their name, give them encouragement, give them HOPE. If you get to know them, visit them on the street, get them a haircut, take them out to eat. Pray and say the rosary with them.

Trade that time you spend in the comfortable, air conditioned chapel where **YOU** pray AND pray with them where **THEY** live. It sure gives you a new perspective on life.

DONT GIVE THEM MONEY. It only enables them with their problems.

Heroes physically help the handicapped, the physically or mentally disabled or elderly.

Some parents that chose life and are raising physically or mentally handicapped children are the SUPER HEROES.

Peter Assuma, YOU are my SUPER HERO.

HEROES go out and visit the elderly in nursing homes and hospitals.

We have several brother Knights that are living in this environment. Bill Whiting, John Yardley, Peter Assuma, Matt Donohue and several others, you are my HEROES.

A SUPER HERO would feel guilty if they can only visit a nursing home or hospital only two times a week. They even visit those they don't even know?

All the people that stand up for the moral issue of Pro-Life are HEROES in my eyes. Those who stand at the abortion mills get all sorts of fingers, VULGARITIES, rude comments and harassment, yet they are not to JUDGE and ALWAYS respond in a loving, kind way. Just for standing in prayer with signs like this. Bob, PETER, Matt, Thomas, John, Frank, and the many others ... YOU ARE MY HEROES.

"feel good" for a little while, BUT it REALLY makes a <u>LIFELONG</u> <u>EFFECT</u> on us when we get active and get our hands dirty.

I'll use two short analogies.

In the world today, you might feel some fear. You are not getting any younger and decide you need to buy a gun to defend yourself and family in case someone breaks in. The gun store sells you a gun and a box of ammo. You go home and put them in a safe place. Without some practice shots at the range, you might FEEL good and safe but is a waste of money because you never **practiced action**.

The same is true with a Bible. You are feeling a "little spiritual." To prove it, you buy a nice, big Bible and display it on the shelf to show everyone how pious and saintly you are, but you don't read it.

More feel-good, no action and more money wasted.

Just recently, I learned about the "FAITH IN ACTION" Program model of the Knights. (Thanks John) I will read a few sentences for time sake.

"We know that the chance to roll up our sleeves and demonstrate our faith through service is as powerful as it is rewarding. The calling is a fundamental part of the Knights history and foundation of our program model, FAITH in Action.

The Faith in Action model allows us to come together to share our faith, celebrate our fraternity with our families and do what we do best ... stand shoulder-to-shoulder in service to our community and defend LIFE in all stages and in every condition."

That's what I thought the Knights were about.

I suggest we all read this document and act on it as much as we can.

Let me sound like an Evangelical and close with an Altar Call. You don't need to come up front and kneel.

In the next couple months, this Florida Amendment 4 will become front and center.

I described this misleading and purely evil bill that will allow FULL TERM abortion with no limitations, no parental consent and with no definition of a doctor in our last meeting.

A lot will be asked of us to defeat this. Polls are now up to 68% of those who want it accepted and it only takes 60% to pass.

This is our time to shine and defend LIFE just like the Faith in Action says. We need the SUPERHEROES of the Knights. A group of Knights as a subcommittee with BLESS to work on defeating this bill.
