Treasurer's Report




The treasurer reported for July through November, income of \$51,830, and expenses of \$50,288, of which \$37,044 was paid out to Charity

YOUR DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

April 24: ORLANDO/ROME

We depart on an international overnight flight to Rome. Dinner and breakfast are served on board.

April 25: ROME

Upon arrival in Rome, we are met by our local Tour Escort and transfer to the city for a panoramic tour of the Eternal city, highlighted by Capitoline Hill and outside visit of Colosseum, an architectural wonder completed in 72 AD where gladiators met in mortal combat. We view the Arch of Constantine, Circus Maximus and the archaeological area of the Roman Forum. We celebrate Mass at a local church. Dinner and overnight in Rome. (D)

April 26: ROME

After breakfast, we enjoy a tour of the Roman Basilicas. We start with visit of the Vatican Museum and the Sistine Chapel, followed by St. Peter's Basilica. After some time for lunch on own, the tour continues with visit of the other three major basilicas in Rome including St. Mary Major, dedicated to Our Lady, (Mass can be celebrated here - subject to availability) St. John Lateran, the Cathedral of Rome, and St. Paul Outside the Walls, built over the burial place of St. Paul. Dinner and overnight in Rome. (B/D)

April 27: ROME - Canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis

Witness history on the momentous day Blessed Carlo Acutis is declared a Saint! Blessed Carlo is the first Saint of the Millennial generation and truly a Eucharistic Missionary for the Digital Age. His canonization will be the highlight of the Jubilee for Teenagers. We will make our way today to St. Peters Square to secure our spot for the canonization ceremony. Witness the grandeur, music, and moving speeches as Blessed Carlo is elevated to Sainthood. In the afternoon we walk to see the Piazza Navona, Piazza Venezia, Piazza Spagna with its famous Spanish Steps, and the Trevi Fountain where tradition says if you toss a coin over your left shoulder, you will return to Rome again. Dinner and overnight in Rome. (B/D)

April 28: ROME/ASSISI

We depart Rome after breakfast for a scenic ride by motorcoach to Assisi. We arrive in the Valley of Assisi where we visit the Basilica of St Mary of the Angels where St. Francis spent most of his life. Here we visit the Chapel, Porziuncola, the rose bush, and the cave where he retired for prayer. We travel up to the quaint hilltop, birthplace of St Francis that still retains something of the atmosphere of the early 1200s, the period when St Francis began his ministry. We visit St. Francis's huge 13th-century Basilica built over his crypt containing many of the saint's possessions and a series of frescoes depicting his life.We continue to the Church of St Clare to see the saint's incorrupt body. The foundress of the Order of Poor Clares followed the teachings of St Francis by living a life of poverty and humility. We may kneel before the San Damiano Cross from which Jesus spoke to St Francis asking him to rebuild His church. At the end of the tour, we visit the tomb of the blessed Carlo Acutis at the church of Santa Maria Maggiore. Dinner and overnight in Assisi. (B/D)

April 29:ASSISI

This morning, we take a tour up to the Hermitage of Carceri located outside Assisi where St Francis and his followers found a secluded place for prayer and meditation. Saint Francis returned there often throughout his life. Here we truly can see why St. Francis was the Patron Saint of birds, animals, and the environment. We return in the city and enjoy a free time on own peace. Walk the quaint narrow streets to shop, enjoy the local cafes. Dinner and overnight in Assisi. (B/D)

April 30: ASSISI/ORVIETO/ROME/ Fiumicino area

We depart for Rome (Fiumicino area) On the way, stop at Orvieto for a short tour of the city and visit the Cathedral of Orvieto Arrival and check-in the hotel in the late afternoon. Dinner and overnight in Rome. (B/D)

May I: ROME/ORLANDO

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to the airport for our flight back home arriving the same day. (B)
