## **AED (Automated External Defibrillator):**



The Council recently purchased two AEDs from the net proceeds of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Party. One AED is mounted on the wall on the left side of the church's vestibule and the other in the Parish Hall on the wall next to the kitchen.

Training was held on Saturday February 22<sup>nd</sup> with about 20 people attending from the Parish community and council members. The trainer was from the American Red Cross and everyone got to practice CPR and watched videos on how to use the AED. After the training, everyone received a certificate of training for CPR/AED from the Red Cross.

AED can save lives by restoring a normal heart rhythm after cardiac arrest. It's estimate that 474 lives are saved each year. If the Parish ever has an event, it's good to know we have AEDs and people trained

for an event.

#### **LIX Super Bowl Party:**

For the first time the Social Committee hosted a Super Bowl Party on Sunday night February 9<sup>th</sup> for brother knights, family members and for any prospective members. After a few technical problems with the internet connection the game was viewed on the large TVs in the Parish Hall. #### **Brother Marty Knecht, Advocate for the Diocese of Palm Beach:**

Here are some definitions for the different types of annulment cases used in the Tribunal. Declarations of Nullity also referred to as annulments.

A Declaration of Nullity is defined as an official declaration of the Church that a particular marriage entered into in good faith was invalid from its beginning.

Informal cases:

1. Lack of Form: for Catholics and Orthodox)

When the form is altogether lacking, one must prove it by documentation

- a. Marriage license
- b. Divorce decree
- c. Baptismal certificate
- d. Completed Lack of Form petition
- 2. Defect of Form (Catholics)

When it appears that the form was followed but some essential element was missing, it but be proved by documentation and the intervention of the Defender of the Bond.

- a. Marriage license
- b. Divorce decree
- c. Baptismal certificate
- d. Defender's brief
- e. Other proofs and testimony
- f. Sentence by the judge
- 3. Ligamen: (Prior bond)

This refers to the previous bond of marriage, or previous marriages of a person. It must be handled like a defect of form case and each marriage must be considered in chronological order, beginning with the first in the case of multiple marriages.
