A MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT

"The prudent sees danger and hides himself, but the simple go on and suffer for it." Proverbs 22:3

We are reaching a confluence of factors that could create a "Black Swan" event greater than any we've seen in recent history. Every year the Knights of Columbus highlight their Disaster Preparedness program for the coming hurricane season. We've also seen the warnings from our County, State and Federal agencies to be prepared. Not to mention that it is a political year.

After retiring from the Navy, I went to work for a contractor that was a Lockheed Martin partner doing work for three letter Federal agencies. One of the events I attended was a DHS conference for DHS leaders. A key speaker explained that he could direct 100 people in 50 cars to drive to 50 vulnerable locations on the US power grid and easily sabotage the entire GRID in minutes which would then take months to restore.

At the same time, experts warned that a once-in-a-hundred-year solar flare could also accomplish the same without warning. In 1859 a very large solar flare reached the United States causing our very crude telegraph system composed of only wires and batteries to spark and cause fires. It was called the "Carrington Event", and experts agree that a similar event today would ruin the power grid, stop all communications, and destroy semiconductors in most electronics including any vehicle built after 1972.

As if that isn't enough, we have thousands of undocumented aliens in our country, many from countries who would like to do us harm. We have possible repercussions from the war in Ukraine and in a bizarre twist, a war in Israel that could have been sparked by efforts to rebuild The Temple signaled by the purchase of "two red heifers" from Texas??

Growing up in Miami I experienced several hurricanes and learned not to take them lightly. The key concern was not the storm itself but the reaction of some people to disasters. At age 14, I personally saw my fist fight break out between two adult men fighting over the last few sheets of plywood at the local lumber yard as Hurricane Donna was approaching.

More recently in 2005 we had a brief Anthrax scare in Atlanta. The report of an Anthrax attack occurred on a Tuesday morning and soon there were radio reports of truckers turning away to avoid Atlanta. By 2pm the grocery shelves were almost bare of key food items as panic buying set in. They say that under normal conditions we are only 2-3 days away from empty shelves without continuous truck deliveries. I believe it. Luckily the scare was determined to be false by

So, you don't need to go full scale survivalist. If things get that bad, we're all doomed anyway. Best thing to do is to grab your rosary and get ready. But short of that, there are many small actions you can take, preparations like having a three-week supply of food, water, and medications on hand. This will permit you to calmly and safely stay in your home while others are running around in a panic. There is no need to buy special 25-year survival food. Just make an effort to stock up on canned goods and non-perishable food when Bogo's or sales come up. And for you Second Amendment practitioners stock up and be proficient.

An excellent guide and good place to start is the DHS "Ready.gov" website. (https:// www.ready.gov/kit). Bottom line, as a senior citizen you don't want to be out "mixing it up" with a panicked and unprepared public.


