## PGK Mark O's Corner Offering!

Peace be with You!

Happy June! A month for Dads & Grads, the start of summer, and school's OVER! Our anthem in high school was by the son of a pastor named Damon Furnier, better known as Alice Cooper, called "School's Out". "No more pencils, no more books, no more teacher's dirty looks". That was back when you could understand the words being sung. Of course, parents would plead: Turn that off!! It doesn't even sound like a girl singing! Mom, Alice is a guy, that's his stage name, geeze.

June also brings us the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ; historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This is a foundation of our Faith, of our Beliefs. Yet today a survey of Catholics finds that increasing numbers doubt the presence of Christ in the **Eucharist. This gave birth to The National Eucha**ristic Revival Initiative of the USCCB; which began on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ in 2022 and continues through 2025. The Council of Bishops state: "we believe the Holy Spirit continues to ask Catholics across America to respond to four invitations. The first invitation calls us to a renewed encounter with WHO we worship. The second invitation calls us to discover in greater depth WHY we worship Jesus in the Eucharist and what this incredible gift means. The third invitation calls for a renewed attentiveness to HOW we worship. The fourth invitation focuses on WHAT we do in response acting on our faith, bringing Christ to others, and spreading the flame of revival.

Take time to look within your hearts, maybe while contemplating on the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. If need be, return to the Catechism of your youth and reconfirm your Belief in the Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.


