While we had to cancel the Hard Rock Casino Trip planned for Oct 10, 2026, we do have two exciting trips scheduled for June and July 2027, each leave from St. Paul Church. In 1 Corinthians 13:13 we read, "And three things remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is Love." What is love? The English language has served us well, in science, technology and literature. But the English language has some limitations. We use the term "love" in many different ways. Some folks love chocolate and Ohio State football. But that is a little different than love of family or fellow man. The Greek language, that formed the earliest Bibles, used three different terms for what we call love. It uses the term "eros" to describe a passionate kind of love... a desire to possess. This is where the term erotic comes from. This type of love is important for human reproduction, but it is not the love that Saint Paul spoke of. Another Greek term for what we call love is "philia." This is a fraternal love, a kind of friendship. It's from this term that we derived the name Philadelphia, the city of brotherly love. This type of love is important for loyalty, community, etc., but it doesn't seem to be the type of love that Saint Paul, or our Lord spoke of. The third Greek term for Love is "agape." Agape means to will the good of another and to strive for it. Ah, this is the love the Lord speaks of. This type of love does not seek to possess (like Eros), and is not loyal to the point of denying truth and justice (like philia). Saint Monica spoke of love being "patient without approving wrongdoing." The Venerable Fulton Sheen said of love, "real love... is the gift of oneself for the good of another." He emphasized that genuine love includes sacrifice, commitment, forgiveness and responsibility. Will the good of others every day, and God bless you all.

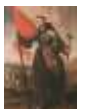
