### SPIRITUAL REFLECTION - FATHER SOJAN

#### The Timeless Wisdom of Blessed Father Michael McGivney

When Blessed Father Michael McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882, he could not have imagined the global impact his vision would one day have. Yet his words and wisdom remain just as relevant today as they were more than a century ago. Father McGivney's insights continue to guide Catholic men in living lives of charity, unity, and fraternity in a world that often needs them more than ever.

One of his well-known reminders to the Knights was this: "Charity is the heart of our work, and unity is its strength." These words echo through the life of every council. They remind us that the work of a Knight is not just about events or programs but about living charity in everyday encounters—being men of compassion, integrity, and service. In a society that often celebrates individual success, Father McGivney challenges us to find our true strength in unity, standing shoulder to shoulder in faith and brotherhood.

Father McGivney also believed in the power of laypeople, especially families, to live out the Gospel in the ordinary routines of life. His vision was not only to support widows and orphans but also to strengthen the domestic church—the family. Today, when families face so many pressures and distractions, his wisdom calls us back to the basics: prayer, sacramental life, and mutual support within the family unit.

Perhaps most importantly, Father McGivney reminds us that holiness is possible in the midst of daily life. He once encouraged the Knights to be men who "live their faith, do their duty, and defend the truth." In a world where faith can sometimes be marginalized, these words are both a challenge and a source of hope.

As Knights of Columbus, we are heirs to Father McGivney's legacy. His wisdom urges us to live with courage, compassion, and conviction. May his words continue to inspire us to build a stronger Church, stronger families, and stronger communities.
