SPIRITUAL REFLECTION - FATHER SOJAN

Dear Friends,

As we move through this season of autumn — when the air turns crisp, the leaves display their beauty, and the harvest is gathered in — we are gently reminded of one of life's most powerful spiritual attitudes: gratitude.

Gratitude is more than simply saying "thank you." It is a way of seeing — a lens through which we recognize God's presence and action in all things, both big and small. To be grateful is to live with open eyes and an open heart, aware that everything we have and everything we are is gift.

In our daily lives, it's easy to focus on what's missing — the plans that didn't unfold, the burdens we carry, the prayers still unanswered. But faith invites us to look deeper. Even in moments of struggle or uncertainty, God's hand is quietly at work — guiding, shaping, and sustaining us in ways we may not immediately see.

Saint Paul reminds us, "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Notice he doesn't say to give thanks for all things, but in all things. Gratitude doesn't deny pain or disappointment; rather, it helps us discover meaning and grace even within them.

When we practice gratitude, our hearts become lighter. We begin to see the beauty in everyday blessings — the smile of a friend, the warmth of family, the strength that comes from faith, the quiet peace of prayer. Each of these is a gentle touch of God reminding us: "I am with you."

True gratitude also moves us to action. When we realize how much we've been blessed, we naturally want to share those blessings with others — through kindness, service, generosity, and compassion. Gratitude turns us outward; it transforms thankfulness into love.

As we enter this month of reflection and thanksgiving, let us pause each day to notice where God's hand has been present. Perhaps in an unexpected kindness, a moment of peace, a challenge that deepened our faith, or a person who reminded us of God's love.

Let us live each day with grateful hearts — for gratitude is not only the memory of the heart, it is also the language of faith. And when we learn to see God's hand in all things, we discover that even the smallest moments are filled with His grace.
