SPIRITUAL REFLECTION - FATHER SOJAN

Preparing Our Hearts: A Knight's Advent Journey Toward Christmas

As we begin the sacred season of Advent, the Church invites us into a time of watching, waiting, and deepening our hope. Advent is far more than a countdown to Christmas. It is a spiritual pilgrimage—a quiet path that leads us from darkness into light, from noise into peace, and from ordinary days into the joyful mystery of Christ's birth. For us as Knights of Columbus, and for our families, Advent offers a beautiful opportunity to renew our hearts and homes in faith.

One of the most familiar symbols of this season is the Advent wreath. Its circular shape reminds us of God's endless love. The evergreen branches speak of life that never fades. And the candles—three purple and one rose—mark the four weeks of preparation. Each week, as we light another candle, the flame grows brighter, symbolizing our increasing readiness to welcome Christ, the Light of the World. Lighting the Advent wreath at home is a simple but powerful family tradition. A short prayer, a moment of silence, a shared intention—these small gestures open our hearts to grace.

Advent is also a season that calls us to slow down. The world around us rushes toward Christmas with noise, decorations, shopping, and busyness. But the Church invites us to something different: quiet expectation. Mary waited in silence. Joseph listened in faith. The prophets longed with hope. We, too, are invited to make room—for prayer, for reflection, and for God's gentle voice. A Knight's life can be busy, but even a few minutes of prayer each day can transform our outlook and strengthen our spiritual foundation.

This is also a time to bring Christ's presence into our families. Advent gives us a chance to gather around the table, bless our homes, share Scripture, and teach our children the true meaning of Christmas. Families can create simple traditions: placing a Nativity set in a special spot, reading a verse of Scripture before dinner, writing down small acts of kindness and placing them in a "manger" for the Infant Jesus, or attending Mass together during the week. These little acts help shape a home where Christ is loved and welcomed.

For us as Knights, Advent is a reminder of our mission. Our founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, built this Order on the virtues of charity, unity, and fraternity. Advent calls us to live these virtues more fully. This season invites us to notice the lonely, to support the poor, to encourage one another, and to bring hope where there is darkness. A phone call, a visit, a donation, a prayer—each act becomes a candle of charity in someone's life.

As we journey through Advent, let us prepare not only our homes, but our hearts. When we light the Advent wreath, let every flame remind us that Christ comes to bring peace, healing, and joy. When we gather with our families, let us remember that the Holy Family walks with us. And when Christmas Day arrives, may we welcome Jesus not merely as a child in a manger, but as the Lord who desires to dwell in our hearts and guide our lives.

May this Advent season be a time of blessing for every Knight and every family—a time of renewal, of hope, and of joyful preparation for the great feast of Christmas.
