

Brother Knights,


With the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King, the liturgical year of the Church is brought to completion, ready to begin the new liturgical year of the Church with the first Sunday of Advent. We are happy to begin this new year of the Church this Advent season. Our Christocentric life continues. We are grateful to God Our Father for the opportunity he has given us to enter into this season of Advent to renew our life with his Son Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit not only in this Advent season but throughout the liturgical year of the Church.

Brother Knights, it is a good principle in life that if we want to succeed in anything preparation is necessary. Advent season is a season of preparation for the coming of Jesus in our lives. Our ancestors in faith (the Israelites) prepared for many years for the coming of the Messiah, Jesus Christ, the Son of God. 
