


THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS



The pious practice to bow our head whenever we heard the name of Jesus or said His name ourselves has not been promoted by the "Renewed Church of the Modernists." Children are no longer taught to do this and as they grow into adults and have children of their own, they are unaware of it.

Jesus' name is known far and wide, but as a word with which to swear profanely. His Name is blasphemed, He is depicted as a homosexual doing unspeakable things to His Own Body, His Mother's perpetual virginity is disdained and so forth. Our culture is strewn with the garbage of sacrilege. If only souls knew the riches of just uttering the Sweet Name of Jesus with reverence and wonder, and the happiness which that Name brings to souls so disposed. (A book THE WONDERS OF THE HOLY NAME by Fr. Paul O' Sullivan, O.P.,)

The name Jesus comes from the Greek Iesous which was derived from the Aramaic, Yeshu. It means "Yaweh is salvation." The name was not unique, even in biblical times, and today it is common in Arabic -speaking East and in Spanish-speaking countries. From apostolic times the name has been treated with the greatest respect, as honor is due the name which represents Our Lord, himself.

The Holy Name of Jesus is, first of all, an all-powerful prayer. **Our Lord Himself solemnly promises that whatever we ask the Father in His Name we shall receive.** God never fails to keep His word.

When, therefore, we say, "Jesus," let us ask God for all we need with absolute confidence of being heard. For this reason, the Church ends her prayer with the words, "through Jesus Christ, our Lord" which gives the prayer a new and Divine efficacy.

But the Holy Name is something still greater. Each time we say, "Jesus," we give God infinite joy and glory, for we offer Him all the infinite merits of the Passion and Death of Jesus Christ. St. Paul tells us that Jesus merited the Name by His Passion and Death.

- Each time we say "Jesus," let us clearly wish to offer God all the <u>Masses</u> being said all over the world for all our intentions. We thus share in these thousands of <u>Masses</u>.
- Each time we say "Jesus," we gain indulgences for the <u>Holy Souls in Purgatory</u>, thus relieving and liberating many of these holy souls from their awful pains. Thus they may be our best friends and pray for us--they cannot pray for themselves, however.
- Each time we say "Jesus," it is an act of perfect love, for we offer to God the infinite love of Jesus.
- The Holy Name of Jesus saves us from innumerable evils and delivers us especially from the power of the devil, who is constantly seeking to do us harm.
- The Holy Name of Jesus gradually fills our souls with a peace and joy we never had before.
- The Holy Name of Jesus gives us strength that our sufferings become light and easy to bear.



The Miriam-Webster Dictionary defines "Divine Providence" as "a Biblical concept that refers to God's plan for humanity and His ability to intervene in human affairs." I would like to share some insights about our ultrasound placement, knowing that this is just the beginning of many instances of Divine Providence related to our ultrasound machine.

Our journey began with our plan to raise enough funds to cover the 50% required for councils to receive matching funds from Supreme to place an ultrasound machine. Initially, we set a two-year timeline for this endeavor, but our Lord had different plans. We were incredibly blessed to raise sufficient funds at our very first event to pay for our portion.

The approval process went relatively smoothly, and we received both Diocesan and State approvals within about six weeks. Next, we contacted our supplier, Philips, who informed us that it would take approximately six months to receive the unit and schedule training. Again, our Lord had other plans; the machine arrived in just six weeks.

The next step was to schedule training, which we anticipated would be straightforward. However, aligning the schedules of four professionals with the operational clinic proved to be quite challenging and took about five weeks to coordinate.

Finally, the big day arrived, and everyone was present for the training. During the session, the phone rang. Closing the clinic for four hours to conduct the training had been easy to plan around existing clients, but what about new ones? The team let the call go to voicemail a couple of times, but when it rang a third time, the director knew she had to answer. It was a young woman in crisis. Committed to her professional role, the director asked the young woman to come into the clinic, informing the training team of the situation and saying she would catch up later. The training coordinator assured her that they were ready to assist if she needed the machine.

The young woman arrived for her appointment with her mother, who was suffering from advanced-stage cancer and had refused treatment. After talking for a while, the young woman agreed to have an ultrasound. Tears flowed from both the mother and the grandmother as they looked at the baby on the screen. The new machine provided a remarkable level of detail, showing the baby's heartbeat as well as its tiny hands and feet growing from the torso. In that moment, the grandmother promised to seek treatment for her cancer and to help the young woman care for her baby. That day, two lives were saved, and a grandmother and a new mom would get to meet God's little miracle.

Humbled beyond description and forever in service to our Lord!



Happy New Year! The Knights of Columbus has very exciting news to share as we jump into 2025.

Beginning January 1, 2025, a dividend increase took effect for eligible participating insurance policies. This is in addition to the increased fraternal benefits announced last year. Inspired by our founder Blessed Michael



What does an increased dividend rate mean?

Dividends are amounts that may be paid annually from the surplus funds of the Knights of Columbus and are paid on an equitable basis by class as determined by the Board of Directors. 1

These dividends can be used in various ways, including to:

- Purchase paid up additions, which is the default option.
- Place the dividends on deposit and earn additional interest.
- Receive the dividends in cash.
- Reduce billed premium.1
- Reduce an existing loan.

Over the past 30 years, Knights of Columbus has paid more than \$22 billion in dividends and insurance benefits.
