



## **MERRY CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR TO ALL!!**

## <u>The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God – January 1, 2026</u> <u>Holy Day of Obligation!</u>

At the beginning of this new year which the Lord has granted us, we do well to lift our eyes and hearts to Mary. For, like a Mother, she points us to her Son. She brings us back to Jesus; she speaks to us of Jesus; she leads us to Jesus. The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God, immerses us once more in the mystery of Christmas. In Mary's womb, God became



one of us, and we, who have opened the Holy Door to inaugurate the <u>Jubilee</u>, are reminded today that "Mary is the door through which Christ entered this world" (Saint Ambrose, *Ep.* 42, 4: PL, VII).

The Apostle Paul sums up this mystery by telling us that "God sent forth his Son, born of a woman" (*Gal* 4:4). Those words – "born of a woman" – echo in our hearts today; they remind us that Jesus, our Saviour, became flesh and is revealed in the frailty of the flesh.

Born of a woman. Those words bring us back to Christmas, for the Word became flesh. The Apostle Paul, in saying that Christ was born of a woman, almost senses the need to remind us that God became truly man through a human womb. There is a temptation, which many people today find attractive, but can also mislead many Christians, to imagine or invent a God "in the abstract", associated with some vague religious feeling or fleeting emotion. No. God is tangible, he is human, he was born of a woman; he has a face and a name, and calls us to have a relationship with him. Christ Jesus, our Saviour, born of woman, has flesh and blood. Coming from the bosom of the Father, he takes flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary. From the highest heaven, he comes down to earth. Son of God, he becomes the Son of man. The image of the Almighty God, Christ came among us in weakness; though he was without blemish, "for our sake, God made him to be sin" (2 Cor 5:21). He was born of woman; he is one of us. For this reason, he is able to save us.

### Florida Knights of Columbus Hockey Challenge 2025-26

Our State Youth Director and Hockey Challenge Coordinator are spreading the word about the Youth Hockey Challenge to our Councils, generating interest, and maximizing participation as much as possible.

The program is run very similarly to the Soccer Challenge, can take place indoors or outdoors depending on what best suits the Council and the school. The equipment to run the event is available for scheduled use from State; and Incarnation Council #15332 has graciously offered to share the knowledge and experience they've gained over the last several months to help organize and promote the event, as well as help with purchasing equipment if your Councils so choose.

The competition does not need to be conducted on ice so the availability of an indoor rink is not prohibitive. The competition can take place on asphalt or concrete, grass or dirt or on a smooth, indoor floored surface. There are hard shooting mats available for purchase to protect a floor and mitigate uneven surfaces. The pucks are fairly soft so they will not damage an indoor surface.

The hockey challenge is a great way for the kids to have fun. Please consider having your Council participate in this program this coming year. Councils should target their competitions NLT the first week of February to leave time for a District competition. If one Council in the District holds a competition, a combined Council/District event may be held sometime during the last two weeks of February. The Region 5 Competition is scheduled for March 1<sup>st</sup>.
