





Update on construction . . .

The **painting is finished** in the Spirit Center but not in the Chelsea Center. This should be **completed over the next 2-3 weeks.** We expect to continue to hold meetings e.g. Council Business, Exemplifications, Committees **throughout this period.**

The **pavers have been delayed due to supply chain issues.** Fr. Gordon expects to see the **pavers on sight in early-August**. Work on the pavers should begin shortly thereafter and **continue for 4-6 weeks**. Spring Training Baseball

BALTIMORE ORIOLES ANNOUNCE 2024 SPRING TRAINING SCHEDULE

Although there are **two or three months left** in the Baltimore Orioles 2023 baseball season, they announced on July 24th their **2024 Spring Training Schedule**. The Orioles will **play a 16-game schedule** at Ed Smith Stadium. The season begins on **Saturday, February 24th** and ends on Saturday, August 23rd. The schedule includes three games against the Pittsburgh Pirates; two games with the Atlanta Braves, Boston Red Sox, Detroit Tigers, **Tampa Bay Rays** and Toronto Blue Jays; and single games with the Minnesota Twins, **New York Yankees and Philadelphia Phillies**. Games times will be announced later.

For the 13th consecutive year, the St. Thomas More and Incarnation Councils will be working a concession stand together. Charlie Culkin will continue as the Team Director. The Councils will operate the Outdoor Patio Grill, where they have worked the past three years. As of now, the menu will be hamburgers, cheeseburgers, hot dogs and sausage peppers & onions; peanuts, popcorn and chips; and bottled soda and water, Gatorade and draft beer.

Like last year, it will take 12 volunteers to operate the concession stand – an average of six volunteers from each Council per game. And like last year, volunteers must make a two-game commitment. The game sign-up sheet will be sent out in early December in an email from each Council. Last year, a number of volunteers stepped forward to work multiple jobs. To provide more staffing flexibility, it would be beneficial if a few more volunteers step forward to learn multiple jobs, such as working as a grill assistant or a cashier. There are Brothers who can train you.
