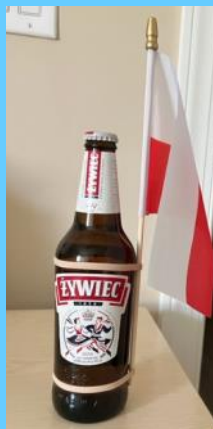

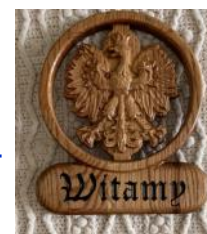
Pierogi Dinner



On May 20, 2023, the Council hosted the inaugural Pierogi Dinner at the Parish Center of Our Lady of the Angels Parish in Lakewood Ranch. The Dinner was scheduled for 4:30 PM to 7:00 PM and was staffed by 33 Knights and 15 members of their families. Event Planning and Execution required over 360 hours.

The purpose of the Dinner was that of a Social Event - through which members of the Knights of Columbus Council 13341, their families, members of the OLA parish community, and members of four other local parishes were invited to enjoy an experience of commiseration while enjoying traditional Polish cuisine – including Pierogi, Kielbasa, Boiled Cabbage, Rye Bread, and Paczki (a Polish Pastry) – served with traditional accompaniments, including Sour Cream, Fried Onions, and Bacon Bits. Beverages included Iced Tea, Lemonade, Coffee, Soft Drinks and Bottled Water.

Diners were greeted by a large Oil Painting of *Stare Miasto* (Old Town in Warsaw) and Polish Embroideries at the entrance to the Parish Center. Tables were decorated in Red and White Tablecloths and Placemats, with Napkins depicting scenes in Krakow and Warsaw. To set the tone, the Centerpieces were Bottles of Zywiec (Polish) Beer with Polish flags attached.



The event was characterized by Polish Music, a 50-50 Raffle, and a Silent Auction that offered Polish Pottery Stoneware, Amber Jewelry, Polish Eagle Wood Carvings, a Polish Cookbook, a Colorized Silver, Czestochowa/Jasna Gora Silver Coin, Cherry Wine, and an Oil-on-Wood Painting. The 50-50 winner was thrilled, and every item (17) of the Silent Auction was claimed by happy winners.

Three hundred and seven (307) diners were served during a 1-1/4-hour period, or one dinner every 15 seconds – without interruption. A canvas of the diners confirmed that the food was delicious and appreciated. A sizable number of diners remained until the event concluded.



Each and every volunteer performed admirably, with special recognition to Jim Jurek, Tom Rokosz, John Farah, Vinnie Cipriano, Mike Chapman, and Rich Macklin.

Although the mission of the Pierogi Dinner was social in nature, it did net \$4,617 – to be donated to a Knights of Columbus designated beneficiary.

Corpus Christi

Council Members participated in a procession around the perimeter of Our Lady of the Angels Church in honor of the feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (aka Corpus Christi).

Father carried the Monstrance with the consecrated Eucharist inside to 4 stations on the 4 sides of the church and prayed at each station. Habitat Yard Work

On Saturday, May 13th, 2023, 7 Knights of Council #13341 responded to the triangle property across the street from the Habitat Depot in Palmetto and assisted, along with other volunteer groups, landscaping at three of the four new homes currently under construction.

The project team completed the following tasks:

- Removed wood forms from recently poured concrete driveways.
- Raked and graded front yards for sod installation.
- Laid three (3) pallets of sod to complete landscaping at the three homes.

Upon completion of the above tasks the project team responded approximately one mile away to two (2) prior completed Habitat homes on 2nd Ave. W, Palmetto, currently under rehab for new owners, and completed the following tasks:

- Laid six (6) pallets of sod in front and rear yards of residence located at 2608 2nd Ave. W., Palmetto.
- Raked up, shoveled, and collected several yards of crushed shell at residence located at 2622 2nd Ave. W., Palmetto. Shell was wheelbarrowed ten (10) houses away to #2608 where it was dumped into and spread out in a designated shrub bed area in the front of the house.
- Laid one pallet of sod at #2622 in yard area previously occupied by crushed shell.

Catechism Corner

The Seven Sacraments – Part 1

Because it is impossible for human beings to live according to the commandments of God without His divine help, Jesus Christ established His Church and instituted the Sacraments as necessary means for the salvation of the faithful. Through the Sacraments – which are entrusted to the Church – divine life is bestowed upon us. They assist individuals in their spiritual progress and growth in holiness. The Sacraments also contribute to the Church's growth in charity and in giving witness.

Sacraments are outward signs instituted by Christ, to give grace. There are seven Sacraments (CCC 1210-1666):

Sacraments of Christian Initiation

Baptism

Confirmation

Holy Eucharist

Sacraments of Healing

Penance and Reconciliation

Anointing of the Sick

Sacraments of Vocation

Holy Orders

Matrimony

Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders can be received only once, since they leave an indelible mark on the soul of the recipient. The other Sacraments have no such restriction.

Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony are so-called Sacraments of the Living. Recipients must be in the state of grace (free of any conscious, un-confessed mortal sins) to receive them; otherwise, they sin grievously by sacrilege.

Baptism frees a person from original sin and all personal sins – and from the punishment due to them, and makes the baptized person a sharer in the Trinitarian life of God through Sanctifying Grace. It imparts the Theological virtues (Faith, Hope and Charity) and the Gifts of the Holy Spirit - Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord. (Grace and Virtues will be discussed in subsequent editions of *Catechism Corner*.)

Confirmation confirms, strengthens and deepens Baptismal Grace.

Holy Eucharist is the Sacrament by which Catholics partake in the Body and Blood of Christ (bread and wine transubstantiated into the Real Presence – as opposed to the symbolic or commemorative). The Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian living and the high point of God's sanctifying action on the faithful and their worship of God – the point of contact between them and the Liturgy of Heaven. So important is this, that participation in the Eucharistic celebration (Mass) is obligatory on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

The remaining sacraments will be discussed in the next edition of *Catechism Corner*.
