

Florida Bishops Oppose Extreme Abortion Amendment

They are urging all Floridians to vote 'no' on Amendment 4 that has been placed on the November 2024 ballot

TALLAHASSEE | The <u>Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops</u> is urging all Floridians to vote 'no' on Amendment 4. An extremely grave amendment that has been placed on the November 2024 ballot that seeks to erase pro-life protections by inserting language into the Florida Constitution banning regulation of abortion. Here is the bishops' statement:

Florida Bishops Oppose Extreme Abortion Amendment Vote No on Amendment 4 Florida Amendment 4, which will appear on Florida's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme proposal that legalizes full-term abortion with no protections for the preborn child, including when the child is capable of feeling pain. This proposed amendment to our state constitution would prohibit all restrictions on abortion before viability and create a broad exception that any healthcare provider could exploit to allow abortion up to birth.

Furthermore, the amendment would effectively overturn or seriously jeopardize common-sense state laws that have regulated abortion for years. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws limiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor's abortion. These risks demonstrate the extreme nature of the amendment.

We urge all Floridians of goodwill to stand against the legalization of late-term abortion and oppose the abortion amendment. In doing so, we will not only protect the weakest, most innocent, and defenseless of human life among us but also countless women throughout the state from the harms of abortion.

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision of society. Direct attacks on innocent persons are never morally acceptable, at any stage or in any condition. In our state, human life is repeatedly being destroyed by abortion. Over 84,000 vulnerable and voiceless children were aborted in Florida in 2023.

This matter concerning the respect for human dignity and the fundamental value of human life is of grave importance to both our Church and our state. The threat of abortion remains our pre-eminent public policy priority. Therefore, we support a coordinated campaign to mobilize against the proposed amendment. To this end, we offer this prayer to defeat Amendment 4:

Prayer to Defeat Florida's Abortion Amendment

Ever-living God, you give life and desire a future for all your children. Take hold of our nation, state, and community and awaken in every heart awe for the gift of life. Send your Spirit to strengthen us with wisdom and fortitude as we defend mothers and children in Florida from laws that disregard their health and safety.

Mary and Joseph trusted in you and welcomed Jesus into our broken world. God Almighty, we ask their intercession to protect the preborn and their mothers, and to guide all parents in raising their children. May they help us build a civilization of love by upholding the sacredness of life and accompanying pregnant women in need. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.






Knights of Columbus Council #12196 Welcomes You

We are excited to welcome **Fr. Richard Rosin**, as our new Pastor here at St Luke the Evangelist.

Father Rosin was born in Astoria, New York and was ordained to the priesthood for the Salesians of Don Bosco on May 28, 1995. He first came to the Diocese of St. Petersburg in 2010 with the Salesian order, working from 2010 to 2015 as a Guidance Counselor at St. Petersburg Catholic High School. From 2015 to 2017, he served as President of the school, after which he was assigned to a parish outside the Diocese of St. Petersburg.



In 2020, Father Rosin expressed an interest in becoming a priest of the Diocese of St. Petersburg and was permitted by his Provincial Superior to return to our Diocese, living outside his religious community. He served as Parochial Vicar of St. John Vianney Parish, St. Pete Beach for two years and has provided ministry as Parochial Vicar of Espiritu Santo Parish, Safety Harbor, since July 2022.

2 Knights of Columbus fly helicopter rescue missions to Haiti, saving almost 150 people

CV NEWS FEED // Two Florida Knights of Columbus who flew three helicopter rescue missions into Haiti this spring saved 143 trapped people.

The Knights of Columbus newsroom <u>reported</u> that Florida Congressman Cory Mills on March 10 asked Knight Anthony Marinello to fly into Haiti and rescue a group of American citizens who had been trapped by gang violence as they visited an orphanage in the country's capital, Port-au-Prince. Marinello was the 13th pilot Mills' office had called. The other 12 were unable or unwilling to take on the mission.

Marinello, a former law enforcement pilot, called Benny Matos, a close friend and colleague, to enlist his help.

"When he said these Americans were serving an orphanage, the first thing I thought about was Father McGivney and his care for orphans," Matos told KofC. "My 'yes' was instant after that."

Matos, Marinello, and two other men entered Haitian airspace around 2:30 a.m. on March 12, then touched down for 67 seconds to receive 14 trapped American citizens. After minor complications at an airport in the Dominican Republic, where they stopped to catch a shuttle to Santo Domingo and change planes, they made it back to the U.S.

According to KofC, the Florida government asked Marinello to do another rescue mission within days of completing the first, as the government estimated that 400 to 600 state residents were trapped in Haiti.

The second mission was performed in coordination with Haitian officials, but complications and encounters with armed Haitians slightly impeded the mission, leading to a narrow getaway with 14 evacuees safe in the helicopter.

Marinello and Matos eventually made a third trip, where they flew back and forth between the northern city of Cap-Haïtien and Port-au-Prince in the south, picking up groups of eight to 10 people from the capital.

KofC reported that the two Knights were personally responsible for the rescue of 143 people out of over 700 evacuated from Port-au-Prince. However, they remained humble and brushed off comments about heroism, saying that they just did their duty.

"Our code—and anyone else who's served in law enforcement—is that we respond when someone's in trouble," Matos told KofC. "It didn't matter if it was average Joes or corporation presidents. All we knew was that people needed to be saved, and that was enough for me."

"When you get the call, you have to go," Marinello added. "Some jobs are just more dangerous than others."


According to KofC, Marinello explained to his wife why he went on the rescue missions.

"She'd ask me, 'Why must you help those people? Why do you put yourself at risk?" he said. "Because, I told her, who's going to help them if I say no? I was the 13th helicopter company they called. The 12 in front of me all said no. So at what point do you say yes?

"Sometimes you have to sacrifice and put your life on the line for others," he added.

*Overview for the Month

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."
