

#### Chaplain's Message

#### "October: A Month of History and Heritage for the Knights of Columbus

Dear Brother Knights,

October has always been a special month in the history of the Knights of Columbus. On **October 2, 1881**, the very first council—**St. Mary's Council No. 1**—was instituted in New Haven, Connecticut. From those humble beginnings, the Order has grown into a worldwide brotherhood of over 2 million members, united in faith and charity.

October also brings us to **Columbus Day (October 13)**, a celebration closely tied to our identity. Since the late 19th century, the Knights have been among the strongest voices promoting Columbus as a symbol of Catholic contributions to America and of courage in pursuing new horizons. For us, this day is not simply about history, but about continuing the mission of our Founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, to witness to faith, fraternity, and service.

In **October 1961**, the Order marked another milestone with the dedication of the **Knights' Tower** at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C.—a visible sign of our enduring devotion to Mary. And in **October 2003**, Pope John Paul II declared Father McGivney "Venerable," recognizing his heroic virtue and bringing him closer to sainthood.

As we look back at these milestones, let us be inspired to carry forward the vision of our Founder, living our faith with courage, unity, and charity. October reminds us that we are part of a rich history—and that together, we are building a future rooted in the Gospel.

This October let us challenge ourselves by asking: What steps can I take—through prayer, service, or fraternity—to leave behind a legacy of faith and charity, just as Blessed McGivney did for us?

#### **Exorcist Diary #363: Is Evil Winning?**

This life has often been described as a spiritual combat between good and evil. In recent days, it appears that evil is winning...



Innocent children were recently shot in church while they prayed. A faith-filled young husband and father was publicly assassinated. Almost daily there are inexplicable shootings of innocent people followed by shooter suicides. As I write this, there is yet another shooting of innocent people in church while they were praying. And more...

The rolls of those practicing the Faith have steadily declined. Statues of demons are appearing in public. Witchcraft and the occult, unthinkable a short time ago, is now increasingly normalized. Its practitioners are rising exponentially. The family is under attack. The list of evil's "triumphs" seems long.

The Exorcist, in the ancient Rite of Exorcism, tells the demons: "Why, then, do you stand and resist, knowing ... that Christ the Lord brings your plans to nothing?" Further on he adds: "The longer you delay [leaving the afflicted person], the heavier your punishment shall be." The demons are reminded that at the end time, they will be judged not only for rejecting God, but also for all the suffering they have inflicted on others. Demons are rightly terrified of the final judgment.

In reality, there is no battle. Satan likes to think of himself as equal to God. He likes to think there is a real battle. But against God, this mere created angelic being is dust. St. Michael himself reminded Lucifer of this cosmic inequality: "Quis ut Deus?" [Who is like God?]. The answer, of course, is "no one". God is one and He alone is the Almighty.

But, in a stunning unexpected twist, God does not "win" by projecting his power and authority. This Satan cannot understand or fathom. Satan rules his dark kingdom as a merciless tyrant. Instead, God "wins" by his humility, service and love. He bows down to help us, and even offered his Son on the Cross. Satan wanted Jesus killed and thought he would triumph with Jesus' assassination. But it was precisely in this loving self-sacrifice that Satan was definitively and permanently defeated.

Everything Satan does is self-defeating. Evil, by its very nature, is self-defeating. The Rite of Exorcism again reminds Satan: "It is futile to resist His will. It is hard for you to kick against the goad." As exemplified in the crucifixion of Jesus, whatever Satan does actually redounds to his defeat. Simply put, he cannot win. He has already lost. In fact, it was never a battle. Creatures do not defeat their Creator.

Most importantly, God gives us His personal example of how we are to "win". We "win" by serving. We "win" by our humility. We "win" by our loving self-sacrifice. God teaches us this by His own example, and it is his most important lesson.


The only battle left is for our souls. Will we serve in humility like our God or arrogantly dominate like Satan? Will we choose to love or to hate? God grant us the grace to choose wisely.

#### Remember the Pardon Crucifix

Many contemporary Catholics have forgotten about the "**Pardon Crucifix**". It seems to be a remnant of a bygone era in Catholicism. The Crucifix deals with the concept of "indulgences". The word indulgence originally meant kindness or favor. In Latin it meant the remission of a tax or debt. Under Roman law it was used to express release from captivity or punishment. In this instance, an indulgence is given to remit the temporal punishment of sin that has been forgiven. These indulgences have been declared upon the Pardon Crucifix by Pope St. Pius X in 1905, and have been approved in the pardon of the living and the souls in Purgatory in 1907 (no longer mentioned in the new enchiridion)

- 1. Whoever carries on his person the Pardon Crucifix, may thereby gain an indulgence.
- 2. For devoutly kissing the Crucifix, an indulgence is gained.
- 3. Whoever says one of the following invocations before this crucifix may gain each time an indulgence: "Our Father who art in heaven, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." "I beg the Blessed Virgin Mary to pray to the Lord our God for me."



5. Whoever, at the moment of death, fortified with the Sacraments of the Church, or contrite of heart, in the supposition of being unable to receive them, will kiss this Crucifix and ask pardon of God for his sins, and pardon his neighbor, will gain a Plenary Indulgence.

According to the current Enchiridion Of Indulgences the above indulgences are no longer in effect. "Enchiridion" means "handbook," and the Enchiridion of Indulgences is the Church's official handbook on what acts and prayers carry indulgences and what indulgences actually are. These practices, however, still grant those who use them many graces. In addition, these following indulgences do apply to any crucifix:

1. The faithful, who devoutly use an article of devotion (crucifix or cross, rosary, scapular or medal) properly blessed by any priest, obtain a partial indulgence.

2.To the faithful in danger of death who cannot be assisted by a priest to bring them the sacraments and impart the apostolic blessing with its attendant plenary indulgence (according to canon 468, 2 of the Code of Canon Law) Holy Mother Church nevertheless grants a plenary indulgence to be acquired at the point of death, provided they are properly disposed and have been in the habit of reciting some prayers during their lifetime. To use a crucifix or cross in connection with the acquisition of this plenary indulgence is a laudable practice.

Today's effective indulgences are listed in the Apostolic Penitentiary's Enchiridion of Indulgences, in addition to those declared by the Holy Father. (The Apostolic Penitentiary is a department within the Vatican responsible for items relating to the forgiveness of sins).

This is not to say that the pardon crucifix is not a beautiful and worthy sacramental to bring into one's life. It is, but one must be careful not to use it as a tool in a fruitless quest for indulgences. Indulgences are a wonderful gift from Christ and His Church, but without a genuine pursuit of His Heart we might find ourselves lost. Indulgence's and sacramentals should be used as a tool as we seek to draw closer to Christ, or should be applied to other souls needing Christ's grace.

The Front of the Crucifix: Above the cruciform figure, the familiar I.N.R.I. has been inscribed with the words "Jesus Nazarenus Rex Judaeorum. "" Latin uses I instead of the English J, and V instead of U (Iesvs Nazarenvs Rex Ivdaeorvm). The English translation is "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews."

The Reverse of the Crucifix: On the transverse arms are the words, "Father, forgive them." On the vertical beam of the Cross are the words, "Behold this heart which has so loved men." An image of The Sacred Heart of Jesus is shown in the center.





#### \*Overview for the Month

October falls during the liturgical season known as *Tempus per Annum* or **Ordinary Time** (formerly *Time After Pentecost*), which is represented by the liturgical color green. Green is a symbol of hope, as it is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. The liturgical color green is worn during the praying of Offices and celebration of Masses of Ordinary Time.

The month of October is dedicated to the **Holy Rosary**. The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7.
