MARCH – THE SEASON OF LENT PREPARING US FOR EASTER



The themes of Lent are Baptism and Penance. Lent was originally a time of final preparation for the reception of the sacrament of Baptism at the Easter Vigil. In the ancient church, the sacrament of Baptism was performed once a year at Easter. Only adults who were educated in the Catholic Faith were baptized. No one could be baptized until they had learned the catechism. When a person had a sufficient grasp of the Faith, he/she was put forth as a candidate, or

"catechumen." Final examinations or "scrutinies" were given to these catechumens 40 days before Easter to decide who was ready to be baptized at Easter. Through the two-fold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. During Lent penance should not be only inward and individual but also outward and social, and should be directed toward works of mercy (such as helping at a fish fry or a fundraising dinner?).

THE POPE'S PRAYER MESSAGE FOR LENT 2024: "Woe to us if our Christian penance were to resemble the kind of penance that so dismayed Jesus. To us too, he says: "Whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting" (Mt 6:16). Instead, let others see joyful faces, catch the scent of freedom and experience the love that makes all things new, beginning with the smallest and those nearest to us."
