CELEBRATE OUR COUNCIL'S NAMESAKE FEAST DAY ON JUNE 22



Council 7121 is named after St. Thomas More, Renaissance man, poet, scholar and lawyer. More was a devout Roman Catholic and studied monastic communalism, briefly considering joining either the Carthusian or Franciscan orders. Besides speaking fluent Latin and Greek, he studied French, history, and mathematics, and also learned to play the flute and the viol. As a legal scholar, he fought any form of heresy, especially the incursion of Protestantism into England. His legal abilities elevated him to Lord Chancellor of England, second in power only to King Henry VII.

His story was made famous in the "Man for All Seasons", in which he opposed the king on the matter of royal divorce, refusing to swear the Oath of Supremacy which declared the king the head of the Church in England. He resigned the Chancellorship and was imprisoned in the Tower of London, beheaded for refusal to bend his religious beliefs to the king's political needs. "I die the king's good servant," he told the executioner, "but God's first."

St. Thomas More was beatified by Pope Leo XIII in 1886 and canonized in 1935 by Pope Pius XI. Pope John Paul II in 2000 declared him the patron saint of statesmen and politicians, adopted children; difficult marriages, large families, widowers, civil servants, court clerks and lawyers.

COUNCIL DONATES \$1K TO ANCIENT ORDER OF HIBERNIANS





At the April 25 business meeting the council voted to donate startup funds to the St. Johns County Ancient Order of Hibernians, which chartered both a mens and ladies division at St. Anastasia in 2023. The Ancient Order of Hibernians of America is an Irish and Irish-American organization that traces its roots back to the organization of the Defenders in Ireland in 1565 to protect Roman Catholic priests and the Church against English persecution.

The St. Johns County AOH division now has grown to 18 men and 20 ladies, who showed up in force (right) to march in the 2024 St. Patrick's Day parade, kicking off the St. Augustine Celtic Music and Heritage Festival. The groups meet at 7:00 pm on the 3rd Tuesday of the month in the Formation Center.




COUNCIL 7121 ASSISTS NEW COUNCIL 18358 WITH STARTUP FUNDS



GK Bill Remy (center) presents a check for \$500 to GK David Zachary of newly-chartered Council 18358 at their regular business meeting on May 21 at St. Ambrose Church in Elkton. St. Ambrose Parish was established when a small wood frame church was built in 1875 by Father Stephen Langlade, a skilled carpenter from France who also built a rectory, school, convent, and a larger church by 1907. The council is named in honor of Father Langlade.

A second convent was built after the first one burned in 1917, and a new parish hall was built in 1938. Students attended the school from 1881 through 1948 under the tutelage of the Sisters of St. Joseph, who lived in the convent. The early settlers of the area were farmers of Spanish, Irish, Minorcan, Greek, and Italian heritage. Their descendants, with names such as Ashton, Floyd, Lopez, Masters, Ortagus, Pacetti, Pappy, Pellicer, Rogero, Sanchez, Solana, Solano, Triay, Weedman, and others, continue to live in the area and attend the small parish church. The pioneers whose daily lives were intertwined with St. Ambrose Parish are buried in the cemetery nearby.



FATHER SEAMUS SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED



A total of \$6,750 in scholarships has been awarded to ten students from six parish families. In its 15th year, the Fr. Seamus Scholarship Fund has awarded \$71,250 to students of Cathedral Parish School and St. Joseph Academy.

Changes to the scholarship program are being considered to be compatible with rules and regulations of the State of Florida Step Up For Students.

Read the statement from the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops flaceb.org/abortion-amendment

No. 4 Constitutional Amendment, Article 1, New Section

Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion before viability or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider. This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.



GOVERNMENT INACTION IN HAITI – KNIGHTS IN ACTION

You probably did not hear any media reports of a daring midnight helicopter rescue on March 11, 2024 of American columnist and author Mitch Albom ("Finding Chika", "Tuesdays With Morrie", "The Little Liar"), his wife and eight volunteers from the Have Faith Haiti Orphanage in Port-au-Prince, which the Alboms have supported for over 10 years. Albom was unable to flee the unrest or get help until reaching out to Florida congressman Cory Mills. Mills, who served in the U.S. Army 82nd Airborne Division from 1999 to 2004, personally mounted an overland rescue of a family of four from Afghanistan during the chaotic American



withdrawal in 2021. Mills turned for help to Anthony Marinello, owner of Tropic Air Charters in Fort Lauderdale. Marinello, a former Army First Sergeant and New Jersey State Police helicopter pilot, enlisted his friend with a similar service and pilot background, Benny Matos of Jupiter. Both Marinello and Matos are Brother Knights in Council 4955 in Pompano Beach. Matos is also a Field Agent for the Knights and was ordained a Permanent Deacon in 2023. 
