## **OCTOBER – MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY**

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, in the sense of "crown of roses" or "garland of roses". It is also known as the "Dominican Rosary". According to a 15<sup>th</sup> century account, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses, and told him to preach it to others.

Early tradition attributes the defeat of the Albigensians at the Battle of Muret in 1213 to the Rosary. St. Pius V attributed the great defeat of the Turkish fleet on the first Sunday of October, 1571, to the fact that at the same time the Rosary confraternities at Rome and elsewhere were holding their processions. Until about the 15th century hundreds of mysteries were part of the Rosary devotion. The 15 Sorrowful, Joyful and Glorious mysteries that we know today were definitively fixed as "the Mysteries of the Rosary" in the 16th century by Pope Pius V. Pope John Paul II, in his encyclical, *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, in 2002 added the five Luminous Mysteries.




