

NOVEMBER – THE MONTH OF MEMORIALS, FEASTS AND SOLEMNITIES





The main feast days are the Solemnity of All Saints (November 1), The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) (November 2), the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome (November 9), The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (November 24), and St. Andrew (November 30). The other saint days are: St. Charles Borromeo, (Nov 4), Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome (Nov 9), St. Martin of Tours, (Nov 11), St. Josaphat (Nov 12), St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (Nov 13) St. Albert the Great (Nov 15), Sts. Margaret of Scotland and Gertrude (Nov 16), Presentation of Mary (Nov 21), St. Cecilia (Nov 22), Sts. Clement I and St. Columban (Nov 23), and St. Catherine of Alexandria (Nov 25).

COUNCIL 7121 DONATES WINTER COATS

Coats for Kids Program Chairman Bill Coleman (left) delivers 6 cases each with 24 lightweight children's winter coats to Tami Boettger and Jacey Ramirez from the Homeless Student Task Force of the St. Johns County School District. The coats were delivered on October 4 as an early start of the winter clothing conducted during each November by Somebody Cares St Augustine.

Coats and other winter clothing, to be given to the 500 homeless or unaccompanied youth in the school system, are collected at participating churches during the month of November, and delivered to the St. Johns County School District's clothes closet located at King Street Storage, 238 W. King St. unit 316, at the NE corner of Palmer and West King St. In addition to winter coats, sweat shirt jackets, lightweight jackets, new socks, and new underwear are also being collected in this drive.
