DECEMBER – THE MONTH OF MANY SEASONS



December starts with Advent, the joyous and hopeful season that precedes Christmas, with the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love celebrated on the four Sundays beginning Dec 1.

In preparation for Christmas, Pope Francis encouraged us to prepare our hearts daily for the coming of Christ: "On this day of joy, we are all called to contemplate the Child Jesus, who gives hope once again to every person on the face of the earth. By his grace, let us with our voices and our actions give witness to solidarity and peace. Merry Christmas to all!"

While much of the world celebrates Christmas the entire month of December (if not earlier, with Christmas shopping sales starting just after Labor Day), the liturgical Christmas season begins with the Christmas Eve vigil Mass on December 24, 2024, and concludes this year on January 8, 2025 (officially the Sunday between Jan 2 and Jan 8). The 12 Days of Christmas (the days, not the catchy 12-verse carol) are a subset of Christmastide, the time between the Nativity on Dec 24 and the Feast of Epiphany ("Three Kings Day") on Jan 6. The "12 days" are an adaptation of pre-Christian "yule" festivals held to help ancient Europeans through the longest nights of the year during the winter solstice.

Amendment 4 is Defeated!! Pro-Life Message Prevails

The Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops has released a statement on the defeat of Amendment 4 on Florida's General Election ballot

"We are profoundly relieved at the defeat of Florida's pro-abortion Amendment 4. This is a positive outcome for Florida and all efforts to promote the flourishing of our state.

Though Amendment 4 failed to reach the 60% threshold required to pass, a **majority** of Floridians voting in the general election supported it. While significant gains to protect women and preborn children in recent years will remain in place, abortion in Florida will continue at a very high rate under our current laws.

"Much work remains to open hearts and minds to the dignity and goodness of life in the womb and at every stage. We will continue to proclaim in our churches and in the public square the value of every human life and to highlight that there is a better way forward for women, families and society than abortion.

Through our many ministries, we will continue to support, encourage and assist pregnant women and young families. For those who regret their abortion or abortions, or their cooperation in one, we reiterate that the Lord is eager to forgive, and the Church is ready to facilitate healing. God bless the people of Florida."
