JANUARY 2025 NEWSLETTER





The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus which is celebrated on January 3. January begins with the conclusion of the Octave of Christmas, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God on January 1, also celebrated by the Catholic Church as the World Day of Peace, a tradition established by Pope Paul VI and confirmed by Pope John Paul II. The next feast of the new year is the Solemnity of the Epiphany on Jan 6, but in the U.S. Epiphany is celebrated on the Sunday after Jan 1. On this feast, the Church celebrates the manifestation (epiphany) of Christ to the Nations (Gentiles) in the persons of the Magi - also known as the Wise Men or the Three Kings:

Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. On the feast of the Epiphany, many Catholics bless their homes by writing the Magi's initials and the numbers of the year on the top of their front door frame with chalk: **20 C + M + B 25**, representing the Latin blessing *Christus mansionem benedicat*, which translates as "May Christ bless this house." Other feast days in January include St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (January 4), St. Andre Bessette (January 6), St. Raymond of Penafort (January 7), The Baptism of the Lord (January 12), St. Anthony, Abbot (January 17), Sts. Fabian and Sebastian (January 20), St. Agnes (January 21), St. Francis de Sales (January 24), Conversion of St. Paul (January 25), St. Angela Merici (January 27), St. Thomas Aquinas (January 28) and St. John Bosco (January 31).

JAMES EARL CARTER, JR., 39th PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

The White House has ordered flags to be flown at half-staff across America in honor of former President Jimmy Carter until Tuesday, January 28. According to a proclamation signed by then-President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1954, flags are to remain at half-staff for 30 days from the day of death of a sitting president or former president. This is the longest period possible for the flags to fly at half-staff.

A national day of mourning will be observed on Thursday, Jan. 9
