Though the shortest month of the year, February is rich in Liturgical activity. It contains a feast (Presentation of our Lord) that bridges two other seasons (Christmas and Easter). The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd harkens back to the Christmas mystery of Light except that now, Christ, the helpless babe, is "the Light of Revelation to the Gentiles who will save his people from their sins." Candles, symbolizing Christ our Light, will be carried in procession on this day, as will be the Paschal candle during the Easter Vigil Liturgy. In addition, the faithful may receive in February two of the four major public sacramentals that the Church confers during the liturgical year: blessed candles and the blessing of throats.

Liturgical feasts in February include Feb. 2 Presentation of the Lord; Feb 3 Feast of St. Blaise; Feb 6 St. Dorothy (patroness of gardens); Feb 11 Our Lady of Lourdes and Feb 22 The Chair of St. Peter

While preparing for the January food drive, a report came in that the Spuds-Elkton-Armstrong (SEA) food pantry building had burned down on Jan 3. A sign board and donation basket were put up at the parish Wine & Cheese social on Saturday evening, Jan 11 and the Sunday pancake breakfast on Jan 12. \$333 in cash was collected. SEA is one of several local social service agencies supported by the parish Outreach Ministry. An additional \$600 in donations was collected during the January Food Drive, all forwarded to SEA through the parish.

For more than 25 years, the Spuds-Elkton-Armstrong (SEA) Community Help Resource Center at 6408 Armstrong Road in Elkton has served residents of the rural communities in the SW part of St. Johns County, operating a food pantry and clothes closet every Friday morning, and serving hot meals in the outdoor dining area.

On January 3, 2025, a fire destroyed the storage shed (back building highlighted in the center of the picture) along with three large freezers, two refrigerators and a large steam hot food table. They had no insurance.





The Presentation of the Lord Blessing of Candles (Candlemas) will take place February 1st & 2nd at all weekend Masses

If you have candles you use for personal prayer and devotion, you are invited to bring them to Mass on the weekend of February 1st & 2nd.

Why do we bless candles every year at this time? February 2 is the *Feast of the Presentation of the Lord*, also known as *Candlemas*. Celebrated since the early 4th century, a tradition developed of bringing candles to the local church to be blessed to be used for the rest of the year in prayer and personal devotion. Since this is an annual tradition, you may want to bring enough candles to last you the rest of the year.
