MARCH 2025 NEWSLETTER



The month of March is dedicated to St. Joseph, whose feast day is celebrated on March 19. He is the patron saint of the Universal Church and the patron of the dying because Jesus and Mary were at his deathbed. He is also the patron of fathers, of carpenters and of social justice. Many religious orders and communities are placed under his patronage, most notably (locally anyway) the Sisters of St. Joseph, who arrived in St. Augustine in 1866. They came at the request of Bishop Augustin Verot, then Bishop of the Diocese of Savannah, and later, first bishop of the Diocese of St. Augustine, to educate and evangelize the freed slaves.

Their legacy survives today in the St. Joseph Neighborhood Center, rising from the ashes of the first school building constructed in 1898, originally called St. Cecilia, later St. Benedict. It was the gift of Mother Katharine Drexel (1858-1955), a wealthy Philadelphia heiress who founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored People and established more than 60 parochial schools around the country. On October 1, 2000, Pope John Paul II named Mother Drexel a saint. Her feast day is celebrated on March 3.

EMMAUS MEN'S RETREAT MARCH 14-16




Emmaus is a retreat weekend designed for those men who feel they would like to explore a deeper relationship with God, whose hearts are ready to “burn” again or need to be reignited.

FOUNDERS DAY CELEBRATED ON MARCH 29



On Oct. 2, 1881, a group of men met in the basement of St. Mary's Church on Hillhouse Avenue in New Haven CN. Called together by their 29-year-old parish priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, these men formed a fraternal society that would one day become the world's largest Catholic family fraternal service organization. They sought strength in solidarity, and security through unity of purpose and devotion to a holy cause: they vowed to be defenders of their country, their families and their faith.

These men were bound together by the ideal of Christopher Columbus, the discoverer of the Americas, the one whose hand brought Christianity to the New World. The name “Knights” appealed to the Civil War veterans in the group who saw noble principles of knighthood in the Order's protection of the faith, family finances and the civil and religious rights of Catholics.

On March 29 – a day celebrated annually as Founder's Day – the Connecticut legislature granted a charter establishing the Knights of Columbus as a legal corporation.




