MAY 2025 NEWSLETTER



The month of May is dedicated to The Blessed Virgin Mary. Feasts related to Mary include St. Joseph the Worker (May 1), Our Lady of Fatima (May 13), and the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (May 31). The entire month of May in 2025 falls within Paschaltide, also known as Eastertide, the 50 days between Easter and Pentecost. The Catholic church focuses on the Resurrection of Jesus Christ during this period, and there are no major liturgical feasts between Easter and the Feast of the Ascension. The traditional Ascension Thursday, which used to be a Holyday of Obligation 40 days after Easter, occurs on May 29 this year. As a result of major changes during the Second Vatican Council and formal updates by Pope John Paul II in the 1983 Code of Canon Law, U.S. bishops' conferences have been permitted, with the approval of the Holy See,

to direct the observance of weekday holy days to Sunday. To better fill the pews, most ecclesiastical provinces of the United States since at least 1999 have "moved" Ascension Day to the Seventh Sunday after Easter, which is June 1. Stay tuned next month for more moveable feast days and memorials.
