

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The main liturgical feasts in October are: St. Thérèse (1), Guardian Angels (2), St. Francis of Assisi (4), St. Bruno (6), Our Lady of the Rosary (7), St. Denis, St. John Leonardi and St. John Henry Newman (9), St. John XXIII (11), St. Callistus I (14), St. Teresa of Jesus (15), Sts. Hedwig and Margaret Mary Alocoque (16), St. Ignatius of Antioch (17), St. Luke (18), St. Paul of the Cross (20), St. John Paul II (22), St. John Capistrano (23), St. Anthony Mary Claret (24), and Sts. Simon and Jude (28).

The last day of October, "All-Hallows' Eve", more commonly known as Halloween, is on the Catholic calendar as the Vigil of All Saints' Day.

This is part of the three-day observance known as the Allhallowtide triduum. While modern Halloween has become secularized, it has deep roots in Catholic liturgical tradition, and it serves as a time for the living to remember and pray for the saints in heaven and the souls in purgatory on All Saints' Day (November 1) and All Souls' Day (November 2).



#### HABITAT FOR HUMANITY DIRECTOR SPEAKS AT COUNCIL MEETING

Addressing the 25 Brothers assembled at the Sept 25 business meeting was Tom Torretta, Fundraising Director of Habitat for Humanity St. Johns. Tom announced the acquisition of a 32 acre parcel in West St. Augustine and plans to start building 74 affordable homes starting in 2027. He described the process of building new homes for qualified families using a combination of federal and state funding, state tax credits, St. Johns County financing subsidies, corporate donations and private donations (that's us!).

#### MORE THAN A FOOD DRIVE GENERATES A GRAND RESPONSE

After taking the summer off, MORE THAN A FOOD DRIVE kicked off to a very good start in GRAND style. We collected the usual 2000 lb of food, but even better, received an **extra one grand** in donations, hitting an exceptionally high total for the fall season with **\$5865** in monetary donations to St. Francis House, Catholic Charities, St. Johns Ecumenical Ministries Food Pantry, and the Homeless Ministry.

The biggest pot at the end of a rainbow had \$2345 going to Sr. Anne Halpin's Outreach Ministry, with (right) Caroline Volk from the Wildflower Clinic shown holding the proceeds. That's the good news. The bad news is that, nationwide, food pantry donations are down, government food assistance from the Big Beautiful Bill has been slashed, and more people are going hungry and



homeless. This proves you cannot trust politicians to feed the hungry, cloth the naked, shelter the homeless. Generous people, like those at St. Anastastia, are stepping up to help the neighbor.


