The Knights of Columbus "Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities", commonly known as the Tootsie Roll Drive, is a heartfelt annual fundraiser supporting children, teens, and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

- Origins: Launched in 1970 by a few Illinois councils, the initiative began with distributing Tootsie Rolls for small donations, raising over \$30,000 in just its first weekend—a success that quickly spread statewide and eventually nationwide.
- Purpose: The primary goal is to fund grants that improve healthcare, education, and quality-of-life programs. Funds support public and private 501(c)(3) organizations, such as summer camps, residential and vocational programs, Special Olympics, early-intervention clinics, and more—benefiting individuals regardless of the disability they face.
- How it works: Each fall (typically the weekend before Columbus Day), local Knights stand at storefronts or street corners in distinctive yellow vests reading "Helping People with Intellectual Disabilities." For each donation, donors receive a Tootsie Roll in appreciation.
- Impact: The high visibility and simple gesture of a candy token have made this one of the most popular and successful Knights fundraisers. For example, councils in Illinois once raised nearly \$2 million annually; statewide chapters in Florida collected over \$537,000 in a single year
- Reach: Today, the campaign is active across dozens of states and continues to flourish through community involvement and volunteerism
