







### Spiritual Thoughts

"The grace of a Jubilee is to throw open, to open hearts to hope. "Hope does not disappoint!" (Rm 5:5) Pope Francis 24 XII 12

My brothers in Christ,

On Christmas Eve, our Holy Father inaugurated the Jubilee Year, opening the Holy Doors in St. Peter's Basilica. In doing so, he invited us to open the doors of our hearts to Him! He said "the door of God's heart is always open, let us return to Him! Let us go back to the heart that loves and forgives us! Let us be forgiven by Him; let us be reconciled with Him! God always forgives! He forgives everything. Let us allow ourselves to be forgiven by Him!" (*Urbi et orbi*, 24 XII 12). This is the message of Jubilee: God loves us; God forgives us; God is calling us home, to grow in holiness, to enter the door of mercy! Of course this means we must not only be open to His mercy, we must be merciful to others.

Pope Francis chose "Pilgrims of Hope" as the theme for this Jubilee Year. He noted that the world is in need of hope and Jesus is our Hope! How can we grow in hope? Here are some ideas:

- 1) Ask God for the gift of Hope. He will never refuse to share this gift! Then start looking for it. Once you do, you'll see signs of hope everywhere! Make a commitment to see at least one sign of hope each day!
- 2) Commit to being a sign of hope to another person each day. How? Commit to share one random act of charity each day.
- 3) Grow in Hope. Hope grows where faith and love abound. Make a commitment to pray every day, read a little from the Bible every day, and attend Mass at least every weekend if not every day.
- 4) Go to confession at least at least once a month. You will find that it really helps you in your journey of faith.
- 5) Attend Eucharistic Adoration as often as you can. He is waiting for you!
- 6) Participate in a Bible Study, Prayer Group, or Book study. Grow in your faith!
- 7) Be more involved in the Knights, attending meetings and participating in the events. The Knights of Columbus are wonderful pilgrims of hope! You may also want to volunteer with other ministries as well such as our Food Pantry, Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Faith Formation ministries, or one of the Liturgical Ministries. It will be a blessing to you and to your family and those you serve!

"Hope does not disappoint!" (Rm 5:5). May this Jubilee Year truly be one of great Hope for you and your loved ones.

You recognize that it's your duty to continually guard against the erosion of freedoms that we enjoy. Freedom is NOT free.

If you are currently a member of the Knights of Columbus and have completed exemplification of the Third Degree, you are able to join the Patriotic Fourth Degree.



#### REACH YOUR HIGHEST POTENTIAL

The Fourth Degree is a group of outstanding Knights, dedicated to promoting patriotism enlightened by their Catholic faith. These Knights, distinguished by exemplary deeds for God, for country, and the Order, are united by the Fourth Degree to support religious, civic, and charitable causes.

Fourth Degree members belong to local units called assemblies. Each assembly is involved in a wide range of public patriotic activities.

Each assembly maintains a Fourth Degree Color Corps and Honor Guard. Uniformed members wearing the Official Uniform, and swords participate in special civic and religious ceremonies. For this reason, the Fourth Degree is often called the visible arm of the Knights of Columbus.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- To qualify for the Fourth Degree, one must:
  - 1. Be over 18 years of age.
- Be a member in good standing with your Council.
  - 3. Be a practical Catholic.
