CHAPLAIN'S COLUMN

Hopefully Christmas was a joyous and happy occasion, and you begin the New Year with renewed optimism. This would agree with Pope Francis' theme for the 2025 Jubilee Year, calling on us to be "Pilgrims of Hope". Borrowing from a BBC interview with the pope about his Jubilee Year announcement, "the pope emphasized that 'kindness is not a diplomatic strategy' nor 'a set of rules to ensure social harmony or to obtain other advantages' but rather 'a form of love that opens hearts to acceptance and helps us all to become more humble." The Jubilee Year is a special occasion for

all, but especially Catholics, to reconcile themselves to God and to one other.

Just a short time ago the Church celebrated the Baptism of Jesus on January 12th, concluding both the Christmas season and beginning 8 weeks of Ordinary Time until Ash Wednesday on March 5th. Baptism is uniquely a sacrament of hope, when parents of children and adult converts assent to renounce sin and consciously seek divine adoption. Christ consented to John's baptism in the Jordan not to be made holy by the water, but to make water holy, consecrating it to become a source for grace for future Christians.



It is worthy of note that a new church, The Church of Jesus' Baptism, was recently dedicated at the site traditionally revered to be the location of John's baptism of Jesus, on the eastern bank of the River Jordan, about 6 miles north of the Dead Sea. 
Supporting Life

As the annual March for Life and Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn Child in the United States approaches next week, Knights are encouraged to build a culture of life in their local communities through prayer, charity and peaceful demonstrations. Last year in lowa, one council helped to establish a pregnancy resource center in rural Carroll County, rallying the community to fuel hope and offer support to women facing unexpected pregnancies. After just one year of operation, the New Creation Pregnancy Resource Center has already made a significant impact on the rural community of Carroll, lowa. Founded in part by local Knights, the center offers educational resources, mentoring and baby supplies to women facing unplanned pregnancies.

Building Hope



More than 3.6 million Ukrainians have been displaced by the war, with many seeking safety and stable housing in the western part of the country. A temporary housing initiative sponsored by the Knights of Columbus recently opened 10 new modular buildings near Lviv, offering security and community support to refugee families. According to data from the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, approximately 6.5 million Ukrainians now live outside the country, while about 3.6 million Ukrainians are currently displaced internally. Roughly one-third of all Ukrainians have been forced to evacuate their homes, many of them to the western part of the country, which has not been as severely impacted by the war.
