
Last month, I reflected on the core values of the Knights of Columbus serving as a bulwark against

2025 - A Jubilee Year!

Last month I wrote about Pope Francis' declaration in May of a "Jubilee Year". In the Catholic tradition it is a year of forgiveness of sins, for obtaining a plenary indulgence for temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven (i.e. time in Purgatory), and for serving God through service to our brothers and sisters. It begins on December 24, 2024 with the opening of the Sacred Door of St. Peter's at the Vatican. It will end January 6, 2026, the Feast of the Epiphany.

Finding its origin in the Mosaic Law (Leviticus 25), it was reduced from 50 to 25 years by Pope Paul II in 1470. The theme for this Jubilee is "Pilgrims of Hope," noting that the heart of our faith and basis of our hope is the death and resurrection of Jesus.

A Plenary Indulgence can be obtained in several ways.

- By Pilgrimage to a Major Papal Basilica in Rome, the Holy Land, or other designated ecclesiastical sites;
- Praying for the Pope's intentions;
- Receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist within 15 days before or after visiting a Cathedral;
- Engaging in acts of penance, such as fasting or practicing abstinence;
- Donating to the poor or supporting religious and charitable works;
- Performing works of mercy (e.g. visiting the sick or prisoners, feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, welcoming migrants).

Vote No on Amendment 4

Florida Amendment 4, which will appear on Florida's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme proposal that legalizes full-term abortion with no protections for the preborn child, including when the child is capable of feeling pain. This proposed amendment to our state constitution would prohibit all restrictions on abortion before viability and create a broad exception that any healthcare provider could exploit to allow abortion up to birth

Furthermore, the amendment would effectively overturn or seriously jeopardize common-sense state laws that have regulated abortion for years. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws limiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor's abortion. These risks demonstrate the extreme nature of the amendment.
