

CHAPLAIN'S COLUMN

Deacon Tom Dwyer

I recently attended a weekend retreat for permanent deacons in the diocese. The retreat master stressed the importance of baptism, not only as making us adopted children of God, but also empowering us to evangelize Jesus Christ as missionaries.

Matthew Kelly, a prolific Catholic author, states in his recent 33 Days To Eucharistic Glory

that the American Church has lost 50 million members over the last 30 years. In 33 short chapters, Kelly advocates a personal consecration to the Holy Eucharist, rippling outward to the whole world. I think Kelly's theme fits the retreat master's challenge to live our baptism in mission to others. In his 29th chapter Kelly shared a story from Father William Holt, an elderly New York City priest, which I think is a perfect example of evangelization.

One Christmas, Frather Holt knew of a 10 year old girl dying of leukemia. All she wanted was a Cabbage Patch Doll; a



doll all the rage, costing \$75 and impossible to find. Asked by a generous couple what he wanted for Christmas, he told them a Cabbage Patch Doll and 2 walkie-talkies, then passed them on to the girl. The walkie-talkies enabled her to speak with family members when she was in isolation. After she died, Father Holt's thoughtfulness became public knowledge in a public post. Thousands reacted, with those disassociated from religion essentially saying if they had experienced such love, they would have stayed.

May we all be blessed this Christmas with a sincere and generous heart to see Jesus in all our brothers and sisters!
