CHAPLAIN'S COLUMN

In the near future we will enter the Advent Season. Advent is from the Latin word for "coming". That "coming" refers, of course, to Jesus the Son of God becoming human; annually remembered at Christmas.

In the Gospel for the First Sunday of Advent we will hear how Jesus offered this warning to His listeners about the "End Times": "Therefore stay awake! For you

do not know on which day your Lord will come."

The *Intro* prayer for the first Advent weekday mass sums up what our focus should be: "Lord our God, help us to prepare for the coming of Christ your Son. May He find us waiting, eager in joyful prayer." Laid out succinctly are our instructions: "prepare" and "prayer".

"Prepare" in the context of our Catholic Christian tradition obviously means more than completing shopping for gifts and decorating the house! The reason Jesus became human was ultimately to sacrifice Himself on the Cross in reparation for Adam and Eve's origi-



nal sin, and to offer humanity a pathway for divine reconciliation with God. Consequently, we *prepare* by honestly reflecting on our own transgressions, and availing ourselves of the sacramental reconciliation offered by Christ's Church. While the Church readily makes the sacrament of Reconciliation available, we know neither the day nor the hour of our own personal "End Time".

"Staying awake" is not just for seeing Santa! We also need to "stay awake" to maintain a constant moral vigilance to avoid sin.

New Faith in Action Program:

Remembering Our Faithful Departed calls upon councils to honor and pray for the deceased members of their council, families, and parish community. By commemorating the dearly departed, and asking for the intercession of the saints, Knights can help others overcome the grief that accompanies the death of a loved one, strengthen family bonds, promote the unique cultural and religious traditions of their parishes, and help the suffering souls in purgatory

for the deceased. Other means of commemoration can include praying a memorial rosary, offering a Mass for the deceased, praying the 100 Requiem prayer and visiting cemeteries. Councils can also work with their parishes to organize a youth costume party honoring the Saints or clean and decorate gravestones and cemetery plots,
