#### **CHAPLAIN'S COLUMN**

Pentecost brings the Church's Easter liturgical celebration to a close, but a number of significant feasts follow shortly afterward. First is the celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary as Mother of the Church (May 20), celebrated the Monday after Pentecost. On Sunday May 26th, the Church celebrates Trinity Sunday, our Church's solemn celebration of the belief in one God, present in the three divine persons.

The first Biblical revelation of the Trinity appears in the story of Jesus' baptism. As Jesus comes up out of the water, the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus like a dove, and the Father's voice was heard saying, "You are my beloved Son; with You I am well pleased." Jesus attested to the Trinity this at His ascension, commissioning the apostles to make disciples of all nations, "baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The solemn feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) ,celebrated the following Sunday, reflects the belief that Jesus is present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity every time bread and wine are consecrated at Mass by the priest repeating Christ's own words at the Last Supper.

The last two liturgical celebrations to be mentioned are related and track one another: First Friday in June (7th), The Sacred Heart of Jesus; First Saturday in June (8th), Immaculate Heart of Mary. The first is a devotion popularized by the French Visitation Nun Margaret Mary Alacoque reflecting the heart of Jesus Christ as a symbol of God's boundless and passionate love for mankind. It is worth noting that every scientific examination of consecrated communion hosts miraculously changed into human flesh have been discerned to be myocardial tissue of the human heart. The Immaculate Heart of Mary reflects Mary's love for Jesus and for the Father, and it embodies Simeon's prophecy of Mary's heart "being pierced by a sword" at the time of Jesus' Presentation and Mary's pondering in her heart the events at the Finding of Jesus in the Temple.

While the Church resumes its "Ordinary Time" liturgy after Pentecost, we have a treasure trove of celebrations that make Catholicism anything but "Ordinary"!
