

## Habemus Papam



From his very first public appearance May 8th, Pope Leo XIV — the first U.S.-born pontiff in history — has articulated a vision for his pontificate and the Catholic Church: one of peace and unity, centered in Jesus Christ. Before his election, Pope Leo XIV was known as Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, a native of Chicago and a member of the Order of St. Augustine. A former missionary in Peru, where he served as bishop of Chiclayo, he most recently served as prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops since April 2023.

The following are selections of Pope Leo XIV initial comments to the world:

"Peace be with you all. Dear brothers and sisters, these are the first words spoken by the Risen Christ, the Good Shepherd who laid down his life for God's flock. I would like this greeting of peace to resound in your hearts, in your families, among all people, wherever they may be, in every nation and throughout the world. Peace be with you. "It is the peace of the Risen Christ. A peace that is unarmed and disarming, humble and persevering. A peace that comes from God, the God who loves us all, unconditionally."

"God loves us, God loves you all, and evil will not prevail. We are all in God's hands, Therefore, without fear, united hand in hand with God and each other — let us go forward. We are disciples of Christ. Christ goes before us."

"The world needs His light. Humanity needs Him as the bridge to be reached by God and his love. Help us also, and then help each other to build bridges, with dialogue, with encounter, uniting us all to be one people always as peace."

We use the word "UP" to describe when we feel good, when it's our turn to play, or when our team is winning. It's a word that can be a noun, a verb, an adverb, a preposition, or an adjective. "UP" in American English almost universally connotes something "GOOD".

"Ascension" is defined as the act of going upward, as in "a balloon ascension". In astronomy, ascension refers to the rising of a heavenly body above the horizon. It can also refer to moving up to improve one's rank or position. We celebrate the passing of Jesus from earth to heaven as His "Ascension". One can apply all of the previously given definitions of "UP" to this salvific event!



Although celebration of Christ's Ascension, (traditionally the 40th day after Easter), falls on May 29th, the feast has been transferred to June 1st, the Seventh Sunday of Easter. Acts of the Apostles tells of Jesus being "lifted up" into the sky. As the God man, Jesus is certainly a "heavenly body" and by His Ascension reclaimed His position at the right hand of the Father.

Both the first reading from Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel for the feast day are authored by St. Luke. Significantly, both reference the Apostles receiving the Holy Spirit to witness to all nations. The Church has lasted over 2,000 years, and shows no signs of imploding or becoming irrelevant. The latest papal convocation and selection of Pope Leo XIV is ample evidence that the Holy Spirit still resides in and sustains the Church and us!
