Welcome to the St Thomas More Council July Newsletter

Brother Knights,

August 13<sup>th</sup> was a historic day for the Knights of Columbus and for the Catholic Church — it was the first feast day of our Founder, Blessed Michael McGivney.

This was a day of celebration, reflection and prayer. The Church has chosen August 13 to honor our Founder because it falls one day after the anniversary of his birth and one day before the anniversary of his death, when he entered eternal life. During the 38 years in between, Father McGivney answered God's call to defend the family and the faith, most notably by founding the Knights of Columbus. In the words of our Supreme Convention theme, which were drawn from the Apostolic Letter of Pope Francis on St. Joseph, our Founder truly embodied "creative courage" in service to God — and his example should inspire us all to live boldly in faith.

The <u>Papal Message</u> to the Supreme Convention observed that "The joyful event of Father McGivney's beatification, celebrated this past year in Hartford, marked a significant milestone in [the Order's] distinguished history and represents a summons to renewed fidelity to the founding principles of faith, fraternity and charitable assistance to those in need."

For many years, Knights and our families have prayed for our Founder's intercession. His presence in heaven was confirmed by the <u>miraculous healing of an unborn child</u>, the son of a brother Knight. That miracle paved the way for Father McGivney's beatification last October, when he was raised to the honors of the altar. Now, we hope and pray for a second miracle, so that we may soon call Father McGivney a saint.

## **Grand Knight Report**

We had a great beginning to our fraternal year with a Corporate Communion, Officer Installation, and Social. We had 67 attendees at the mass and social. That is a great number for mid-summer! We also had many who came over after mass to attend the Officer Installation. Once again, thank you for your continuing support of the Council and all we do. The strength of our Brotherhood & Sisterhood, with our spouses and significant others, in this Council, provides a solid foundation for all we do as a Council. Not only does it keep this Council strong & vibrant, but it is a main driver on how we attract new members. We had our meeting with Fr. Gordon in July to review our Faith in Action Plan and how we can best support the parish. Once again we received positive support from Fr. Gordon. The only thing holding us back is the uncertainty of the virus. The future is still cloudy and most events are on hold, but once we get the green light we will be off and running. Be prepared! We have a lot of work to do when that time comes and we will need all hands on deck.

As you know, we raised a little over \$1200 from our parish Tootsie Roll Campaign. The council provided checks in the amount of \$605 to both Oak Park School and St. Mary Academy. In recognition of our spring donations to St. Mary, we received a thank you note from St. Mary Academy.

On Sunday night, August 1<sup>st</sup>, STM Council 7826 supported the STM Youth Group in kicking off their community service week, recognizing them for their commitment to community service. We felt it was especially important to recognize them given the climate we currently live in, that they would reach out to learn and help others in the community. STM Council 7826 was pleased to join youth group leader Robbie Anderson, and her adult volunteers, in supporting the group by

joining in on the opening activities and providing a pizza party. Many thanks to Brothers John Cesare, John Koitsch, and GK Jim Meyd for their attendance at the kickoff. The group's week included visits to Streets of Paradise, All Faith's Food Bank and STM Twelve Baskets Food Pantry, and the community of Immokalee, among other learning and helping activities. Each day ended with time for spiritual reflection and sharing of their daily experiences.

We had our District Organizational meeting on August 14<sup>th</sup>. The District Deputy and Warden were both very helpful with laying out the basics of the business side of the council. We will be making an all-out Council effort focusing on VAVS donations for our veterans. Brother Steve McElroy will be heading this for the council. Good News! This is a very solemn day for us to be part of. We need your support! October will be our "Baby Bottle" Campaign at STM Parish. We will need help in distributing the bottles after mass. Dear Brother Knights,

Your immediate action is necessary to prevent taxpayer funding from being used to pay for abortion.
