


St. Thomas More Council 7826 September 2021 Newsletter



"Take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand" (Eph 6:13).


In addition, Tony D'Souza our July Knight of the Month received his certificate.

We are all aware of how fortunate we are to belong to such a vibrant parish. Father Gordon, Father Lawton, and the staff at St. Thomas More work very hard to create an environment of inclusion and support to our parishioners and our local community. In the same way the pandemic has affected us all, so to with our parish. The parish leadership team kept our parish open and available to us all, while controlling expenses across the board. We know that like us, our parish facilities are not getting any younger, and the cost to function and maintain our facilities continues to rise. Please be mindful of this as you look for ways to support our parish financially, and through your continued volunteer efforts. Anything you can do to contribute to your weekly offering, and support of the Catholic Faith Appeal, would be greatly appreciated. By achieving and exceeding our goal, more of those funds are directed straight back to our parish. The parish is still \$100,000 short of its' goal.
