This month there were many Right to Life activities in which members of our Council were active participants. Our Council attended the prayer vigil to kickoff March for Life week in Sarasota. We participated in the 9 Days of Prayer for Life Novena and continued our support of 40 Days for Life 365 on February 24th. Thank you to all who joined in and to our Right to Life Chairmen, Brothers Neil Corrado and Brian Harkins. Our next prayer walk will be on March 24thth. We can always use more participants as this will be a crucial year for the right to life with all the new laws and the court cases currently before the Supreme Court. This year will mark a pivotal time in history and how we will move forward on the issue of our right to life.

We held our first Cruise Raffle drive the weekend of January 22-23rd. We had a great opening weekend collecting \$2100 in raffle sales. We will resume our raffle sales after masses starting on the weekend of March 5-6th. Thank you to Brother Gary & Margot Ellis, and all who participated in selling tickets, for getting this up and running again this year. Fr. Gordon gave us a great kickoff after the 8:00 mass and his support really translated into sales. We will be challenged this year to sell outside of church until March due to other parish commitments. Please consider ramping up your personal selling of tickets this season.

We will be restarting our Coffee & Donuts program after the 8:00 & 10:00 masses. We have scheduled these events to restart on March 20th, April 10th, & April 24th. Thank you to those who have volunteered, and to Brother Larry Hall, for all his work in getting this program back up & running. This is just one more step back to normality. This will help us with our raffle sales.

We conducted our annual Citizens with Disabilities Campaign on the weekend of January 28 -30th, February 4-6th, at two Publix stores, and our parish drive on February 12-13 after all masses. Our Council had fantastic success in raising money for Oak Park School and St. Mary Academy. Our grand total was **\$10, 150**. Thank you to Fr. Gordon, Fr. Lawton, and Mary Maxwell for your support from the pulpit and the parish bulletin. Thank you to all who braved the cold and wind to make the first weekend a success. Right to life

40 Days for Life 365 - The Knights of Columbus has begun a campaign to pray – 365 days a year – at Planned Parenthood facilities. Remember this: **Without the Right to Life, the rest doesn't matter.** Come help us protect and pray for the unborn.

There's no limit on # of people who can sign up for this monthly event. We had at least 2 people per hour in 2021 but more are needed. 2. Spring 2022 40 Days For Life - How about this for a Lenten Resolution – only one hour for one day on Thursday, March 24th?

The 40 Days for Life spring Campaign is almost here! From Ash Wednesday – March 2, 2022 through Holy Saturday, April 10th our Sarasota community will unite with over 600 communities for a major simultaneous pro-life mobilization. The STM Knights are reserving two tables on March 24th that will seat 16 people. All guests of this event are asked to prayerfully consider a donation.

Many of you are familiar with the Community Pregnancy Center just around the corner from Planned Parenthood. They are a worthy partner in our Right to Life activities and allow the use of their facilities during our walks. The Council makes a donation to them every year in appreciation. In addition to pregnancy counseling, they also provide after birth items to support the mother and baby. Please consider making a cash donation, gift cards (WalMart, Target, Publix), or donating any of these items. Diaper cream, 2T-3T-4T pullups, shampoo, lotion, pacifiers, wipes, sleepers (boy & girl), other outfits up to 2T, infant car seat, pack n play with bassinet, and bath towels

Brothers,

March arrives and Lent begins on the very next day, March 2. We all know that Lent is the time of preparation for Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with Holy Thursday. In order to prepare to celebrate the Lord's resurrection we are to exercise self-control and self-denial by fasting. We are encouraged to encounter Christ in the reading of Scripture and we are to serve others by the giving of alms.

If you are able perhaps you can lead or help lead a program at your council. I know for me, being involved with other men of faith strengthens me.

As we prepare spiritually for this new liturgical season of Lent, don't forget the temporal. Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori! I am honored to carry on our blessed founder's vision of protecting Catholic families.
