#### **Grand Knight Report**

The Grand Knight wishes to express to the Council, my family's sincere thank you for your thoughts and prayers on my mother's passing. Your prayers, cards, thoughts, and kind personal words, meant so much to us during this difficult time. Being away for the month of May made it impossible to produce the May newsletter. I will do my best to recap both May and June in this newsletter.

Well here we are at year's end. Who would have thought it would fly by so quickly. The year started by losing our Deputy Grand Knight so quickly. Brother Phil Arsenault stepped up and decided he wouldn't let the Council or his friend continue alone, raised his hand to volunteer and accepted the challenge that lay ahead. With a strong, experienced officer group, and a Council eager to get back to work after Covid, we accomplished many great things together.

The Grand Knight found a strong partner in his Financial Secretary Larry Hall, who gave the Council a great financial plan and guidance, that would be prudent, given the uncertainly of our environment, but allow us to continue our charitable work until the ground beneath us steadied and allowed us to do more, and do more we did.

With the help of every member in this Council, our year was a success on every level. Our membership goal was 10 new members, but our membership team of Chancellor Ralph Neller and Advocate Joe Tiffany, challenged themselves to do more. Together, they combined their effort to recruit 21 new members. Due to their efforts, our Council will achieve Double Star Council. Not an easy task for a seasoned Council with so many members. Our Council received three awards for membership and insurance at this year's state convention. We reestablished our Degree Team under PGK Dan Bulinski and held an in-person Exemplification nearly every month this fraternal year.

Every fundraiser this Council held exceeded all expectations. Our lucky number became \$10,000. DGK Phil Arsenault and his Tootsie Roll volunteers collected over \$10,000 in donations. Brother Gary Ellis and Margot Ellis, and the Council members led a cruise raffle, that we weren't even sure would happen based on circumstances, to gross \$10, 360.

PGK Ken Berberich and his committee started our first ever Council golf outing fundraiser. The outing was planned and executed perfectly, and we also netted close to \$10,000 for the Council.

In addition to our pass through events of Baby Bottles and Tootsie Rolls, we made an additional \$20,000 in donations to our parish and other charities we support.

Along with our brothers from Incarnation, we worked the concession stand at spring training baseball, where each council received almost \$9,000.

We supported the parish youth groups as always, and then found new ways we hadn't done in the past.

We led a parish ministry food drive along with the Women's Club, Food Pantry, and the youth groups to collect over 3,000 lbs. of food to feed the needy.

Our Council assisted in bringing parish events back to normal by leading the Parish Christmas Party, and soon to be restarted pancake breakfasts.

Our Speaker series team lead by Lecturer Derek Noll and Brother Mark Lawrie continued to bring us interesting speakers to our meetings. Wait until you see how this program will grow this coming year.

With Brothers Neil Corrado and Brian Harkins, and all our prayer warriors, STM Council has one of the strongest Right to Life groups in Sarasota, if not the state. With their leadership, and the Council's support, we received the Silver Sponsor award for Pregnancy Center Support at the state convention.

On June 23<sup>rd</sup>, Brother Steve McElroy and the scholarship committee presented \$7,000 in scholarships to Cardinal Mooney High School.

Brother Hank Peppard and his team worked hard every month to make our after meeting social, and so many other events, enjoyable for everyone. No matter what the notice or event, Hank and his team were there. The month of June is a great example of how much they mean to this Council's success.

Brother Dave and Sue Bracy gave us another fabulous year of socials. What a great time we all had attending these fun nights!

We also lost a few Brothers this year in passing, and we learned how important our friendship and commitment to each other mean to each of us. Remember our watchword "Tempus Fugit, Momento Mori." "Time flies. Remember Death."

We learned how strong the Power of One is. Look at what we can accomplish when we act as one in the name of God. There is nothing we can't accomplish.

As they say in the business world, that was yesterday, what have you done for me today? We have another great year in store for us. Please take a moment to read the Faith in Action Plan and Budget for our next Fraternal Year. Our Council is not done doing great things.

Please consider praying outside of the Planned Parenthood facility. Thanks to our Brothers for participating on our day to pray. We have a large Council and we could use your support. With all that has happened these last two years, our rights are constantly under attack. Remember this: Without the Right to Life, the rest doesn't matter. Come help us protect and pray for the unborn. We continue to hear stories from mothers whose babies we have saved by our presence and our prayers for the unborn. Slowly, but, surely, we are winning this battle for preserving the lives of the innocents.

Great news this week from the Supreme Court, in their ruling to return the authority on abortion, back to the states. It is important for us to understand that this ruling **does not** prohibit abortions, but allows each state to decide on its own. We have taken the first step, but there are many more to go. We need to continue our prayer walks and our support of those pregnancy centers we support. Now, more than ever, we need to continue the work we are doing as a Council. Please continue to **safely and peacefully** support the work we are already doing.

Fr Gordon spoke from the pulpit this past weekend reminding us that Right to life includes caring for people from the womb to the tomb. I took the opportunity to review how we, as a Council, recognize our responsibility. While we continue to look at new opportunities to improve and support the lives of others, here are the ways we take our commitment seriously. We support three pregnancy centers,

our youth groups, the Catholic Faith Appeal, Florida State Charities, two local schools that teach children with disabilities, Coats for Kids, both St. Paul Parish and Catholic Charities in Arcadia, Habitat for Humanity, Veterans support, Cervicos Dominican Republic Ministry, Special Olympics, Wheel Chair Program, Scholarship Program, two Seminarians, and the STM Food Pantry. In addition, our Council members volunteer at the STM Food Pantry, St. Vincent de Paul, and Meals on Wheels, Resurrection House, Bethesda House, Special Olympics, and Guardian ad Litem Program. There are many who volunteer in activities outside of these mentioned, including many of our parish ministries. Please continue to look for opportunities that our Council and our members can become involved to make a difference.


### Donation Request – K of C Assembly 3089 – Our Lady of Charity Assembly
