Grand Knight Report

The Grand Knight would like to take a moment to emphasize our Right to Life Program. STM Council is blessed with strong leadership in our Right to Life Program with Brothers Neil Corrado and Brian Harkins at the helm. STM Council has a solid core of Brothers that are constants each month with their prayerful walk in front of Planned Parenthood. What is baffling to me is that with member growth of over 30 new Knights in the last 18 months, the size of our core group remains a constant. All of us joined the Knights of Columbus pledging to live in accord with the Precepts of the Catholic Church and support the mission and activities of our Council. Our monthly prayer walk only asks you to prayerfully walk one hour each month. We don't ask you to sell anything, approach anyone, or do any hard physical work. The Grand Knight asks you to consider supporting our Right to Life Program. Sometimes our actions speak for themselves, other times, words are needed. Whatever the situation, Jesus knows how to speak to each person's heart: we simply need to follow where he leads. This is how we answer our missionary call. This is how we build a culture of life, a culture that joyfully proclaims the truth of God's love, purpose, and plan for each person.

On January 12th we held our Council Meeting. Our guest for the evening, Patty Madsen from Community Pregnancy Center, gave an emotional and impactful talk about her experiences and the services provided at the center. Patty received a standing ovation from the Council. Grand Knight, Jim Meyd presented Patty with a donation check of \$1000 to assist with the services they provide. Lecturer Derek Noll and Brother Mark Lawrie have done a great job with providing us with great speakers.

On January 14th, STM Council 7826 hosted the District 51 mid-year meeting. On January 17th, STM Council held an Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity. Three new members took their degree: John Regan, Wayne Head, and Fernando Villalta. Outside Guard Hank Peppard was named Honoree for the ceremony. A capital campaign has commenced to address the roof and HVAC issues. STM Capital Campaign

This section will be a new and ongoing part of our Council newsletter. I will use this section to keep you aware of progress as it becomes available.

Brother Knights, Grand Knight Jim Meyd has asked that I update you on the status of the St Thomas More "Our Church - Our Future" capital campaign. Fr Gordon, from the pulpit, kicked-off the campaign, the weekend of January 7th -8th. Volunteer cards were passed out by the Hospitality Ministers at all the Masses, this weekend. Prior to this, on January 3rd, over 1300 mailers were sent out by the parish office to the registered parish families. The weekend of January 14th - 15th, "from the pulpit", I followed up at all the masses, with a request for those that did not receive the mailer, that these individuals and families not receiving Fr Gordon's letter were requested to ask for the letter to learn more about the capital campaign and Fr Gordon's vision for the future of our parish. We recognized that there may be many supporters of the parish, that were not registered, part time residents or visitors that support our parish, that had not received Fr Gordon's letter. Further, we recognized that the ParishSoft (parish software) was not wholly correct with certain of the registered members not having current contact information. Simply said, it was our goal to get out to all the supporters of the parish, to receive Fr Gordon's letter and campaign introduction mailer.

Also, from my pulpit discussion, the next step after receiving Fr Gordon's letter was to then, register to attend one of the upcoming capital campaign receptions where you will meet with other members of the parish as to personally meet on the campaign with Fr Gordon and others. These receptions will have light food and beverages as catered for the parish. The reception dates are as follows:

Recall, the purpose of the capital campaign is to raise \$2.5 million as to replace our HVAC in the Spirit Center and Chelsea Center. The HVAC in the Spirit Center is approaching 18 years and the Chelsea Center, over 24 years and all HVAC in

very poor condition. The condenser units of the church are being replaced also. Our roofs need to be replaced in both the Spirit Center and Chelsea Center as the roofs are beyond maintenance and repair and the same age as the facility. Many of our windows in the Spirit Center and Chelsea Center require maintenance. Our pavers are uneven and pose a liability risk to the parish and need to be repaired. Lastly, the exterior of the buildings are being painted. You may have noticed the roofing material onsite this past weekend and painters have been on the premises. The HVAC, window repairs and paver repairs have all been contracted and work will be commencing soon based on material delivery and labor availability. The Diocese of Venice is acting as the general contractor on the project.

As I am writing this, last night, January 18th, was held a Capital Campaign Committee meeting. There are 66 individuals and families signed up as volunteers to the campaign, for the Masses, receptions, phone call team and mailing team. The Capital Campaign Committee is in place and actively working on the campaign with our advisory firm, Guidance in Giving. Many of the parish organizations have met with Fr Gordon and all support the campaign. A special thank you! to the Knights of Columbus, Food Pantry, Women's Club, St Thomas More Finance Committee, Prayer Shawl Ministry, Hospitality Ministers, Choir, St Vincent de Paul Society, Youth Ministry and all others.

There are currently 189 parishioners registered for the receptions. Over 30 families have committed pledges to the campaign at nearly \$630k over the 3 year period of the campaign. Thank you!

I want to recognize the efforts of several Brother Knights for all the work that they are doing for the parish on the campaign - these are Frank Moeslein, Dan Bulinski, Joe Frustaglio and Max Streibel. I'd also like to thank all the leaders and volunteers of the Capital Campaign Committee, the parish office staff and Fr Lawton for all their support and hard work on the campaign. Lastly, a big shoutout to Fr Gordon for his leadership and vision for our parish.

I am honored, along with my wife, Trish Ann to have been named as cochairpersons of the capital campaign - "Our Church-Our Future".

Yes - there is a lot of work yet to be done to make this a successful campaign - we are not raising funds for equipment replacements and repairs - but for us to

have St Thomas More in a position for the next 20 years - so that we can meet here as Knights of Columbus and all the other organizations that utilize the facilities for their missions - and the awesome liturgy that we have, here, at our parish. Nice music too - by the way - thank you Alex!

Thank you Brother Knights for your support of the St Thomas More Capital Campaign.
