Parish News

After several months of meetings, phone calls, cards, and conversations, the initial phase of the Capital Campaign is coming to a close. As Winston Churchill once said, *“Now this is not the end. It is not even the beginning of the end. But it is, perhaps, the end of the beginning.”* The parish has answered the call and their support is reflected in contributions approaching \$2.3 million or 92% of the Capital Campaign goal of \$2.5 million. Brother and Past Grand Knight as well as serving as the Capital Campaign Co-Chair, Ken Berberich, has an update on our progress ahead in the newsletter. As a Council, we will continue to look at ways we can assist the parish to meet this goal.

If you are able, please consider attending at least one daily mass each week. It is a great way to start your day with prayer and the Eucharist. You will find it results in a more meaningful day as you become closer to God.

St. Thomas More is also in need of Hospitality & Eucharistic Ministers. There is a need for Hospitality Ministers for Sunday 12:00 mass. STM Capital Campaign

*(This section will be a new and ongoing part of our Council newsletter.
I will use this section to keep you aware of progress as it becomes available.)*

The "active phase" of the Capital Campaign comes to a close at the end of March. Recall, this is a three (3) year campaign, such that during the upcoming years, through the designated (by Diocese of Venice) campaign period, ending July, 2025, we will continue to seek donations from "new" parish members, visitors and registered families that may be in a financial position to pledge and donate to the campaign that were not able to, at this time and "one time givers" that may be able to re-up annually.

Currently, we show \$2,293,237 in pledges to the \$2,500,000 campaign or a shortfall of \$206,763. We are confident that with the support of the above and others that we will meet and exceed our campaign goal.

We have received cash of \$692,020 and the remainder in pledges.

We have currently met 92% of our campaign goal with 30% of parish households participating, which is 492 households.

We continue to solicit from several individuals who have stated an interest in pledging but have not (yet) turned-in their pledge card.

Thank you! to all those involved in the capital campaign, including the Campaign Committee, Volunteers for Mailers, at the Masses, Receptions and Phone contacts. We appreciate the expertise and support from Guidance In Giving, our campaign consulting firm. We recognize the support of the Parish Office staff members.


Thank you! to Fr Gordon's leadership on the campaign, Fr Lawton, Fr Don Henry and all the visiting priests to our Masses that supported the Capital Campaign "from the pulpit".

Work on campus is now being done on HVAC, Roofs, Painting, Window Repair and the last will be the Pavers.

It has been an honor for myself and my spouse, Trish, to have been named the Co-Chairs of the "Our Church - Our Future" Capital Campaign.

Spring Training Baseball

2023 SPRING TRAINING BASEBALL SEASON IS THE MOST SUCCESSFUL EVER

For the twelfth consecutive year, Incarnation Council 15332 and St. Thomas More Council 7826 operated a concession stand at Ed Smith Stadium during the 2023 Baltimore Orioles Spring Training Baseball Season. It was the first time in three years that the Orioles played a full home schedule. In 2020 and 2021, the seasons were impacted by COVID and last year by the baseball strike.

For the third season, Incarnation and St. Thomas More Councils operated the Outdoor Patio Grill Concession Stand – AND WE DID VERY WELL!!. For the 17-game schedule, the stand rang up \$158,355 in gross sales or an average of \$9,315 per game. Pretty good for a stand just selling hamburgers, hot dogs, sausage with peppers and onions, draft beer, soda, water, popcorn, potato chips and peanuts. We served 7,299 customers or an average of 429 per game.

The above sales resulted in the two Councils earning \$32,277 – the most the Councils ever earned in a Spring Training Season. The earnings came from commissions – 10 percent of net sales – and tips. The commissions totaled \$14,612. However, the Councils big revenue source was credit card tips, which totaled \$16,157. In addition, the Councils received \$1,508 in cash tips. For the year, the Councils earned an average of \$1,899 per game – \$860 in commissions and \$1,039 in tips. After deducting expenses, each Council will receive around \$15,500. The amount is an estimate until the final accounting and check is received from the Baltimore Orioles.

The success of the 2023 Spring Training Season was all due to the great work and commitment of the volunteers from each Council. This year, 23 Brothers and Sisters from St. Thomas More worked the seventeen ball games – Denny Armstrong, Charlie Ballschmieder, Ken Berberich, Dave Bracy, Rob Carver, Charlie Culkin, Scott Deahna, Corey DeVito, Margot Ellis, Mike Giudici, Ted Kovacic, John Malloy, Dan Martin, Mary Martin, Chris McDevitt, Jim Meyd, Ralph Neller, Ray Paleczny, Chris Pariseau, Jack Rodman, Jim Walsh, Dr. Steve Wyer and Teresa Wyer. They worked hard, but they had

fun doing it. Special thanks goes out to Spring Training Baseball Director Charlie and Grill Chefs Dr. Steve and Teresa Wyer who worked every game! They were the first ones to arrive and the last ones to leave the ball park for every game. Also, the following individuals worked a number of games during the season – Denny Armstrong (9), John Malloy (9). Ray Paleczny (9) and Jim Meyd (7) Thank you.

To celebrate all these volunteers hard work, a “Thank You Cookout” is planned in late March at Incarnation Council. The event will be held outside the Finegan Center in the parking lot, where hamburgers, hot dogs, macaroni salad, cole slaw, potato chips, cold beer and wine will be served.

More and more families are suffering economic hardships and consequently more pregnant women are in need of the life-saving services and support provided by MyChoice and Community Pregnancy Centers. Our Council has been requested to participate at the Sarasota Planned Parenthood facility on the 4th Thursday of every month – from 9AM to 1PM. Please consider praying outside of the Planned Parenthood facility. Thanks to our Brothers for participating on our day to pray.

While amazing things happen every year in the blessed work of helping women and saving babies, the *Dobbs* decision from the Supreme Court and the overturning of *Roe v. Wade* has resulted in the need to help more pregnant women considering abortions. A 15 week ban is currently in place in Florida, but abortions have actually increased this past year as our state has become an abortion destination. Most abortions occur prior to 15 weeks and our border states have tighter restrictions which means more women are coming to Florida for an abortion. For this reason, there is now a greater need to continue our prayer walks and our support of those pregnancy centers we now support. Please continue to **safely and peacefully** support the work we are already doing. **Please remember that in accordance with K of C guidelines you cannot handout materials or confront someone entering Planned Parenthood unless you are approached by the person first for information. You are allowed to greet them and pray for them, but do not go beyond that unless they reach out to you.**
