

Grand Knights Report

The month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family. During this month, as we contemplate the colder weather and sometimes feel the isolation that winter brings, we should reflect on the example of family love shared in the everyday lives of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. There has arguably never been a more important need for the strength, unity and grounding that a strong family unit provides in today's society.

The very foundation of family life has been shaken by the failure of so many marriages. For this reason the devotion to the Holy Family of Nazareth takes on a new meaning and a new importance. To live a good, Christian family life requires sacrifice, the renunciation of one's own wishes, and a devotion to others. If it is to be perfect, it requires complete victory over self-love. It requires a high degree of virtue, deep piety and living faith, much prayer, and a closer union with God.

February also begins the Season of Lent. A time for penance and prayer, to retrace our steps, contemplate our past ways and amend our lives to come into closer union with God. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th, and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday, March 28th, It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection.

As Knights, we can also share our time and talents to offer as a personal sacrifice during Lent. With so many volunteer opportunities available: Citizens with Disabilities, Cruise Raffle, and Spring Training Baseball that provide us with personal growth.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and Good Friday, March 29, 2024, are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

BALTIMORE ORIOLES SPRING TRAINING SEASON BEGINS THIS MONTH -

After four months of planning, the Baltimore Orioles 2024 Spring Training Season will begin in three weeks. The Orioles will play a 16-game schedule at Ed Smith Stadium. The season begins on Saturday, February 24th and ends on Saturday, March 23rd.



For the 13th consecutive year, the St. Thomas More and Incarnation Councils will be working a concession stand together. The Councils will operate the Outdoor Patio Grill, where they have worked the past three years. As of now, the menu will be hamburgers, cheeseburgers, hot dogs and sausage peppers & onions; peanuts, popcorn and chips; and draft beer, bottled water, assorted bottled soda and Gatorade.

It will take 12 volunteers to operate the concession stand – an average of six volunteers from each Council per game. There was great interest in working the 2024 Spring Training Baseball Season!



All 16 games were overbooked. As a result, many volunteers were not assigned all the games that they requested. On average, volunteers will work about 50 percent of the games that they requested.

At the St. Thomas More Council Membership Meeting on Thursday, February 8th and the Incarnation Council Membership Meeting on Tuesday, February 13th, I will be distributing the parking passes as well as the hats and shirts to volunteers who ordered them. I look forward to working alongside all the volunteers during the upcoming Spring Training Season, especially all our new volunteers.
