Grand Knights Report

APRIL IS DEDICATED TO THE HOLY EUCHARIST AND THE HOLY SPIRIT

The month of April is considered the start of Spring with new flowers springing up, the annual Spring cleaning ritual, and a sense of new beginnings. In the church, April is also a month dedicated to the Holy Eucharist and the Holy Spirit. The focus on the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist and the mystery of the Trinity provide a opportunity to renew our dedication to the core principles of Unity, Charity, and Fraternity. Our Chaplain, Fr. Daniel, has agreed to share his insights about the Eucharist at this time of the year.

Dear Brother Knights,

I hope you are well. Amongst the many topics that could be addressed, there is a fittingness in this time of the Eucharistic revival for my first contribution to the K of C Newsletter be on the Eucharist. There is an even greater fittingness that I write these words to you on Holy Thursday – the day in which Jesus instituted the Eucharist and in the same moments, founded the priesthood. One can immediately see there is a connection between the priesthood and the Eucharist. Without the priesthood, there is no Eucharist. The Eucharist, in turn, is the source and summit of the Christian Life. It is the source which nourishes and sustains all of us in this world of darkness and tribulation.



A good question that I do not believe has been clearly answered is: "Why is there a Eucharistic Revival in the first place?" It is relevant to each of you because it speaks to the state of the world and the state of the Church. The reason there is a Eucharistic revival right now is because hardly anyone believes in the true presence of Jesus – body, blood, soul, and divinity – in the Eucharist. I dare say: if Catholics understood this truth, then we would see people flooding to the nearest Church at all hours to adore, worship and simply be with our God, who is present in a humble, little host.

And why would we do that? Because we desperately need God. We were created by God to be with God. That is why nothing in this world can ever satisfy us or will ever satisfy us. That is why we are always left with a deep ache within our hearts searching for something more. There is a restlessness in our world today like never before. Sadly, it is because we as a society are trying to remove him or make him irrelevant.

We also desperately need God because we are weak. We are very weak. We fall to the same sins again and again and again. There never seems to be any hope. Receiving Jesus in the Eucharist is what gives us the strength to persevere in the battle and overturn the tide of it. However, we must do so with faith.

Jesus said to St. Faustina: "I am the same under each of the species, but not every soul receives me with the same living faith as you do, my daughter, and therefore I cannot act in their souls as I do in yours."

Recall the passage when Jesus visited his hometown of Nazareth: "He could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands upon a few sick people and healed them. And he marveled because of their unbelief" (Mk 6:5). Great faith begets great results; small faith begets small results or none at all.

Also recall the passage of the woman who had an incurable disease for twelve years. When she touched the fringe of Jesus' garment, "immediately her flow of blood ceased." Jesus then said: "Who was it that touched me?" When all denied it, Peter said, "Master, the multitudes surround you and press upon you!" (Lk 8:45). Many people were "touching" Jesus, yet only the woman who touched him with faith was healed.

It is the same in regards to Jesus in the Eucharist. Many people receive the Eucharist every day or every week and yet there is no change.

Brother Knights, as we go forward, I invite you to make an act of faith when you receive the Eucharist. "I believe Lord, help my unbelief!" Open yourselves, open your hearts to Jesus in the Eucharist with that same faith that he can heal you, and allow him to transform your life. It may not happen like a lightning bolt from the sky, but I promise that if you step out, something will happen.

Our Council was able to cover the food costs for this "Day of Service" in support of the Confirmation candidates and their outreach to those in need within our community.






SMPC 2024 BENEFIT DINNER - LIFE IS BEAUTIFUL!

RIGHT TO LIFE MINISTRY -

It's been a busy Spring! We rallied for our Monthly 40 Day For Life vigils as a Knights team in Jan, Feb and March. Several of us partook in another successful 40 Day for Life which wrapped up on Palm Sunday with over 70 People at the closing event and we gathered and broke bread with fellow Knights and Spouses along hundreds of other defenders of Life at the Annual Community Pregnancy Center Gala at Lakewood Ranch Country Club and in late March at the annual Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center Gala. Lastly and perhaps most importantly we have prayed for and need to continue to pray that the hearts of our country, our culture and our society will turn away for the sin of Abortion to a Culture of Life!

The US Supreme Court and Florida Supreme Court are making huge decisions that will either give the go ahead or prevent the evil of killing a baby in the Mothers womb. In FL, it will be about keeping an amendment off the Nov 5th Ballot that would enshrine aborting a child up until the moment of birth! 

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE-

Our Council offers a Cardinal Mooney Catholic High School scholarship program for children and grandchildren of parents and grandparents who are registered parishioners at St. Thomas More. The scholarships available range from \$1,000 up to \$2,500 and most are sponsored as memorials from Brother Knights or their surviving families.

This month we will highlight the annual \$2,500 scholarship offered through the generous donations of the family of Richard A. Schwehr, a former Sir Knight of our Council.



Richard Schwehr was born on August 8, 1927, the son of an original homesteader in North Dakota.



Richard's elementary education was in a one room school house. He graduated from Assumption Abbey High School in Richardton, North Dakota. After 4 years in the 82nd Airborne, he was honorably discharged as a Sergeant First Class. He married, moved to Cleveland, Ohio and earned a degree in Mechanical Engineering from Fenn College which later became Cleveland State University. After more than 31 years of working for Caterpillar and travelling around the world, Dick retired and he and his wife Sybilla moved to Florida. They were active members of St. Thomas More Parish in Sarasota. Dick was a member of the Knights of Columbus where he became a 4th Degree Knight and a member of the Color Corps. Dick firmly believed in the importance of education for everyone. Upon his passing in September of 2016, his family donated the funds to the Knights of Columbus to start this scholarship program which the Knights have named in Dick's honor.

2024 SPRING TRAINING BASEBALL SEASON IS THE MOST SUCCESSFUL EVER!

For the thirteenth consecutive year, St. Thomas More Council 7826 and Incarnation Council 15332 operated a concession stand at Ed Smith Stadium during the 2024 Baltimore Orioles Spring Training Baseball Season. For the fourth season, the Councils operated the Outdoor Patio Grill Concession Stand – AND WE DID VERY WELL!! For the 16-game schedule, the stand rang up \$169,659 in gross sales for an average of \$10,604 per game. Pretty good for a stand just selling hamburgers, hot dogs, sausage with peppers and onions, draft beer, soda, water, popcorn, potato chips, cracker jacks and peanuts. We served 7,468 customers for an average of 498 per game.

The above sales resulted in the two Councils generating \$33,382 in revenues. The earnings came from commissions – 10 percent of net sales – and tips. The commissions totaled \$15,616. However, the big revenue source was credit card tips, which totaled \$16,234.

In addition, the Councils received \$1,532 in cash tips. For the year, the Councils earned an average of \$2,086 per game – \$976 in commissions and \$1,110 in tips. After deducting expenses, each Council should receive around \$15,950. The amount is an estimate until the final accounting and check is received from the Baltimore Orioles, which should be in mid-April.

April 2024 Council Message

We spend six weeks each year during Lent fasting, praying and almsgiving. We hope to unite our fasting and praying with Jesus' 40 days of fasting and praying in the desert, to focus on preparing both our inner and outer selves to celebrate the great Easter feast. We give alms to identify with that great sacrifice of God giving His only begotten Son. With Easter on March 31 this year, I hope this finds that you had a very blessed celebration of this central Christian feast! Easter certainly brings thoughts of newness and renewal. We hope our fasting, praying and almsgiving renews our closeness to God.

As Spring settles in, I observe the many rituals of the season. I think of newness and renewal. Outside garden beds are prepared for new planning.
