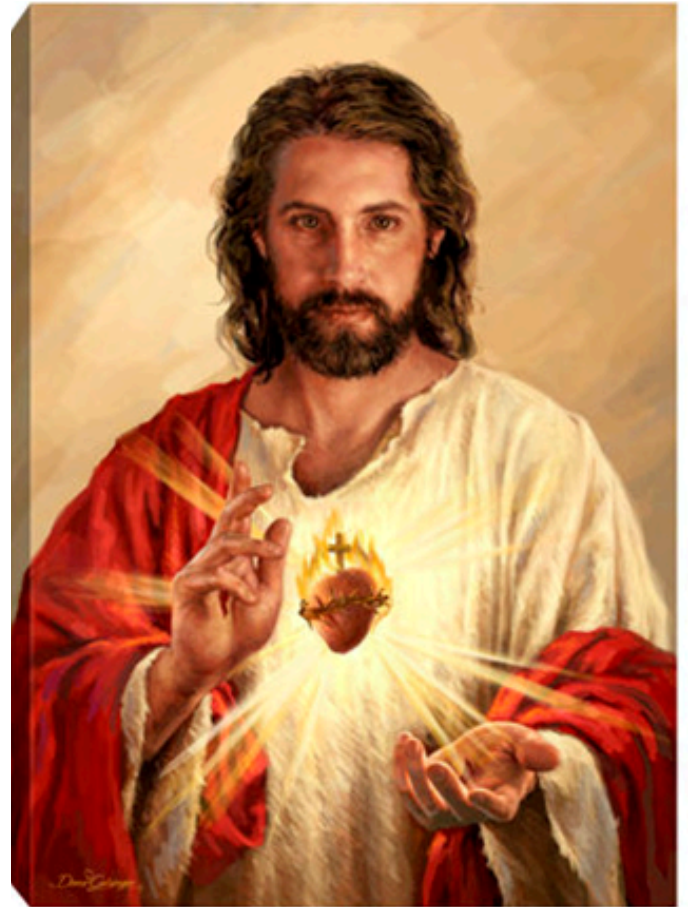

Grand Knights Report

JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART -

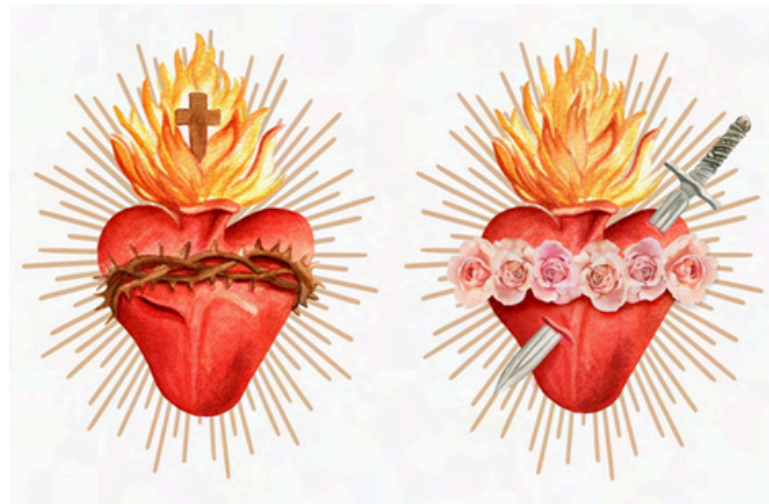
The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a devotion which began in the 12th Century and gained popularity after Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 1670s, revealing to her the image of His Sacred Heart.

It is a month dedicated, therefore, to contemplating the wonderful mystery of the human heart of Jesus that contains all of God's eternal, infinite, self-giving love for each person. Pope Francis has said that it is easier for us to believe in our own love for God than it is for us to believe in God's love for us; in this month, the Church invites us to contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus and let ourselves be convinced of God's passionate love for us.

As we look at the images of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we notice many symbols. Each of these expresses some aspect of God's love for us.

Flames: The Sacred Heart of Jesus burns with divine love. In the Gospel, Jesus says that He has come to set fire to the earth—the fire that He longs to set is the fire of divine love, the fire of the Holy Spirit, in each human heart.

Rays of Light: The Sacred Heart of Jesus is surrounded by rays of light, as if rays of light are emanating from it. The Sacred Heart of Jesus reveals to us the eternal truth of God's love for us, bringing the light of God's love into the darkness of our sin and suffering, our fear and doubt.



Crown of Thorns: We remember that during His Passion, the soldiers placed a crown of thorns on Jesus' head. The crown of thorns symbolizes our individual sins, which prick His heart.

The Cross: In the Gospels, Jesus hangs upon the cross as He dies for us. In the image of the Sacred Heart, the Heart of Jesus no longer hangs upon the Cross, but rather the Cross stands atop the Sacred Heart, as if to say that the Heart of Jesus is what supported the Cross and what supports us when we have to bear a cross.

The Open Wound: After Jesus dies on the cross, a soldier pierces His Heart with a lance, and blood and water flow out.. The open wound in the image of the Sacred Heart shows us that the Heart of Jesus is always open to us, His mercy always available to us, that He never closes His Heart to us.

At this moment in our world, torn by so much violence and suffering, we, as Knights need to let our own hearts be filled with the love of the Sacred Heart, so that God's love fills the world through us.

ST. JOSEPH ICON -

Every few years, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council selects an icon of a saint whose patronage is particularly inspiring to Knights and their communities. Each jurisdiction receives one or several of these icons which travel from council to council and serve as the centerpieces for prayer services in parishes throughout the Order. This year our parish was chosen to display the Icon of St. Joseph for 1 week in May.



Flowing from the Year of St. Joseph declared by Pope Francis we welcome the Pilgrim Icon Program in honor of St. Joseph. Devotion to St. Joseph was understandably slow to develop in the history of the Church. The “just man,” whom God chose to protect, defend and raise the most precious of his gifts to humanity had not a word of his recorded in Scripture. Tradition tells us that our Lord’s foster father died — likely with Jesus and Mary at his side — even prior to Jesus beginning his public ministry.

Since its inception in 1979, the Knights of Columbus Pilgrim Icon Program has held more than 174,800 local council and parish prayer services with some 22 million participants.

Pope Francis received the Order’s Board of Directors in a private audience, during which the Holy Father said “I commend all of you in a special way to the intercession of St. Joseph, the protector of the Holy Family of Nazareth, who is an admirable model of those manly virtues of quiet strength, integrity and fidelity which the Knights of Columbus are committed to preserving, cultivating and passing on to future generations of Catholic men.” Bearing those words in mind, I chose to entrust my service as Supreme Knight to St. Joseph, and through this Pilgrim Icon Program, we can all turn in prayer to St. Joseph.

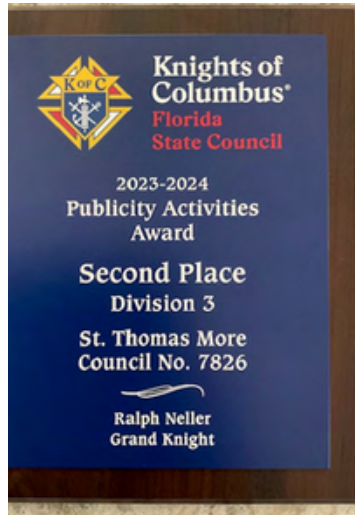
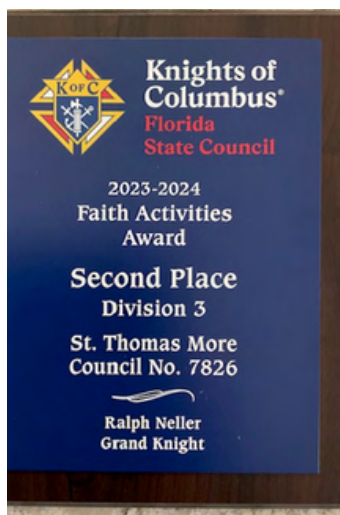

MESSAGE FROM THE PARISH OFFICE -

SAFETY POLICY - With the advent of the new state-wide policies on homelessness, all local parishes have been dealing with the homeless in and around their properties. As Catholic Christians we are empathetic with their situation but this predicament presents increased safety concerns. Your involvement and support have been noticed and is sincerely appreciated.

STM PICNIC - Father Gordon is happy to announce that STM will hold a parish-wide picnic on Sunday, October 27, 2024 after the 12:00 Mass. Worthy Charlie Culkin and Luchie Child have agreed to Co-Chair this year's picnic.

FUND RAISING POLICY - Effective July 1st through June 30, 2025, every ministry may rely upon Bulletin ads, pulpit announcements, tickets sold at the office reception and email blasts to promote their event. Each ministry is allowed to promote their fundraiser after Mass a total of 3 times per fiscal year. Each ministry must schedule the dates a minimum of 30 days apart. Each ministry will be allowed to select from 2 planned weekend days for each month to meet their total of 3 appearances. Only 1 ministry per weekend day will be allowed.

(This policy will not apply to: 2nd collections, and Baby Bottles with unmanned weekends.)

This month we are honored to highlight the scholarship which has been generously sponsored by Brother Hank Peppard for many years. The Hank Peppard Family Memorial Scholarship Fund.

Hank Peppard is a fourth-degree member of the St. Thomas More Council 7826 of the Knights of Columbus. One of the founding members of the council, he has served as an officer and one of its most active members since its origin in 2011. In 2017 Hank was named Knight of the Year by the council. Hank established this scholarship fund to honor his family members who have left this earth to be with God. In 1983 his beloved son, Hank Peppard, Jr. died at age 13 when he was struck by a car while riding his bicycle home from school.

In 2003 Hank lost his father, Henry Peppard, Sr. at age 94. Hank's mother, Louise, who moved to Florida to live with Hank for 8 years, passed on in 2013 at age 98.

Another tragedy struck Hank's family when he lost his niece and nephew in a house fire. Bill Peppard Jr. was 8 years old and his sister, Jackie, was nine at the time. Their father, Hank's brother Bill, was a Grand Knight in his Knights of Columbus council in Oceanside Long Island. He succumbed to a heart attack in 2008 while volunteering with the Knights of Columbus calling Bingo numbers at his parish in Long Island.

In March 2021, another member of the Peppard Family was lost. Bill Peppard's daughter, Debbie S. Metzler passed away at age 63 from cancer.

John Koitsch, our videographer, has made a video of the event and this has been sent out to those involved in the golf outing.

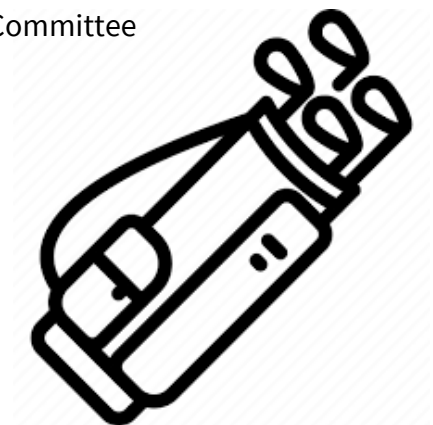


Feedback - we have been called the most organized event by the golf club and the golfers "love our event" as it includes a light breakfast, golf, BBQ lunch and various awards and prizes.

That doesn't even include the nearly \$21 million distributed through Knights of Columbus Charitable Fund via grants by donor clients. To be a Knight is to be part of a culture of giving – and in terms of business, it's a culture that turns insurance premiums into charitable impact.

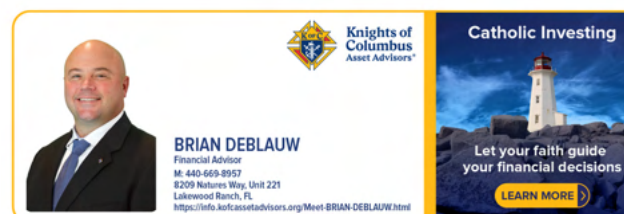
