SEPTEMBER MARKS THE END OF SUMMER WITH THE CELEBRATION OF LABOR DAY-

The Knights of Columbus and Labor Day share an underlying principle: the dignity of work and the worker. At first glance, you might not see a clear connection between the two, but a closer examination reveals intriguing overlaps that highlight the shared values of community, service, and worker welfare.

As Knights we don't shy away from the intersection of faith and labor. Our Catholic teaching calls for just labor practices, including fair wages and safe working conditions. Our members have often stood in solidarity with workers, recognizing that labor is not just an economic issue but a moral one as well.

Labor Day originated in the late 19th century, a period marked by significant social and economic changes. The industrial revolution had led to longer working hours and unsafe conditions for workers. The holiday was initially proposed by labor unions to celebrate workers and draw attention to their rights.

The Knights of Columbus was founded by Father Michael J. McGivney, a Catholic priest who was concerned about the wellbeing of his parishioners, many of whom were working-class immigrants. They were often subjected to poor working conditions and had no social safety net.

Father McGivney's vision included providing for families who lost a breadwinner and promoting social activities that were in line with Catholic values. Over time, the Knights expanded their reach to include insurance programs, educational support, and other forms of community service.

So, as you enjoy your Labor Day barbecue, please take a moment to consider the values that make this more than just a long weekend. The principles celebrated on Labor Day are very much alive within our own Knights of Columbus Council 7826. We will continue to advocate for the dignity and well-being of workers and to the shared values of community, service, and worker welfare.

VOTE "NO" ON AMENDMENT 4 -

Amendment 4 entitled – "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion" would repeal all Florida laws on abortion, even common-sense laws that most people on both sides of the issue support, like parental consent for minors seeking an abortion, informed consent, and laws that protect the safety of women.

Principally the language used in the ballot description of Amendment 4 camouflages the purpose of this proposed change to Florida law with deceptive and misleading statements. What the amendment allows are:

- No restrictions on late-term abortions
- No doctor is required
- No parental consent is required

At issue is the health and well-being of the mother as well as the unborn.


Due to its misleading and deceptive language a panel of state economists has been legally successful in requiring the ballot to include the following "Financial Impact Statement" to better understand the potential impact of this proposed amendment.

FINANCIAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The proposed amendment would result in significantly more abortions and fewer live births per year in Florida. The increase in abortions could be even greater if the amendment invalidates laws requiring parental consent before minors undergo abortions and those ensuring only licensed physicians perform abortions.

There is also uncertainty about whether the amendment will require the state to subsidize abortions with public funds. Litigation to resolve those and other uncertainties will result in additional costs to the state government and state courts that will negatively impact the state budget.

An increase in abortions may negatively affect the growth of state and local revenues over time. Because the fiscal impact of increased abortions on state and local revenues and costs cannot be estimated with precision, the total impact of the proposed amendment is indeterminate.





The next "Knight's Mass" will be on September 4th at the 8:00 a.m. Mass.




KEEPING THE PROMISE -

2025 ORIOLES SPRING TRAINING SCHEDULE -



Last month, the Baltimore Orioles announced their 2025 Spring Training Schedule. The Orioles will play a 16-game schedule at Ed Smith Stadium. The season begins on Saturday, February 22nd and ends on Friday, March 21st. The schedule includes three games against the Pittsburgh Pirates; two games with the Atlanta Braves, Detroit Tigers, Minnesota Twins and Toronto Blue Jays; and single games with the Boston Red Sox, New York Yankees, Philadelphia Phillies and Tampa Bay Rays. The 16th game will be on Saturday, February 15th, when New York Yankees Prospects will play against Baltimore Orioles Prospects – the game is not listed on the official schedule.

For the 14th consecutive year, the St. Thomas More and Incarnation Councils will be working a concession stand together. Spring Training Baseball is the largest fundraiser for both Councils. During the past thirteen years, the Councils have earned \$186,080 in commissions and tips. In their first year (2012), the Councils split \$3,725. Last year, the Councils split \$33,382. The 2025 Spring Training Season should be another profitable year.

For the 22nd Spring Training Season, Charlie Culkin will manage a concession stand at Ed Smith Stadium. Charlie will be the Director for the St. Thomas More/Incarnation Team for the 14tth consecutive year.. The Councils will operate the Outdoor Patio Grill, where they have worked the past three years. As of now, the menu will be hamburgers, cheeseburgers, hot dogs and sausage peppers & onions; peanuts, popcorn and chips; and bottled soda and water, Gatorade and draft beer.

Like last year, it will take 12 volunteers to operate the concession stand – an average of six volunteers from each Council per game. And like last year, volunteers must make a two-game commitment. The game sign-up sheet will be sent out in early December in an email from each Council. Last year, a number of volunteers stepped forward to work multiple jobs. To provide more staffing flexibility, it would be beneficial if a few more volunteers step forward to learn multiple jobs, such as working as a grill assistant or a cashier. There are Brothers who can train you.

Let's have a great 2025 Spring Training Baseball Season!! See you at the Ball Park!


