Also, other ministries are involved with the Ladies Club providing the cookies and other treats for dessert and the Youth ministry working on a Christmas project with the children.

While all of this is taking place, Christmas music is playing and a group is singing Christmas carols. We can't forget Santa. He is also a Knight and takes the stage to meet and greet the children of the parish. In all, the Parish Christmas Party exhibits the best of our Council and our parish through the many hours of volunteer work by so many people and its coordination with other ministries celebrating the birth of the Christ child.

Later in the month we also celebrate our own Council Christmas Party at Stoneybrook CC. This gives every member and their wife or significant other a time to celebrate their many blessings and our success in helping others through our charitable work throughout the year.

ADVENT AND THE FEASTS OF THE BLESSED MOTHER -

Advent begins on Sunday, December 1st, and provides a significant time for us to prepare for the birth of Jesus and to reflect on His second coming.

Advent is a time to prepare for Christmas and to think about what's needed to be ready for Christ's return. It's a time to teach patience and to remind ourselves to put our hope in God. Advent ends on December 24th.

This month we also celebrate the feast days of the Immaculate Conception and Our Lady of Guadalupe. Both of these feast days celebrate the Blessed Mother.

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception, celebrated on December 9th, honors the Catholic belief that Mary was conceived without original sin, while the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, celebrated on December 12th, commemorates the appearance of the Virgin Mary to Saint Juan Diego in Mexico in 1531, marking a specific apparition of Mary rather than a theological concept about her conception. Essentially, the first focuses on Mary's sinless origin and is a Holy Day of Obligation, while the second focuses on a specific historical event where she appeared to Juan Diego in Mexico.

Both of these days are celebrated in the U.S. For the Knights of Columbus, the Immaculate Conception, is particularly important as Mary is the patroness of our Order worldwide. The feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is celebrated more regionally as the patroness of the Americas. Both feasts celebrate the patronage of our Blessed Mother.

VETERAN'S DAY REMEMBERANCE-



The 15th Annual Catholic Mass on Veterans Day at Sarasota National Cemetery was celebrated to thank God for all who serve or have served in the U.S. Armed Forces, including those who are on active duty, as well as those who have died, and their families.

More than 800 people attended the Mass which takes place in Patriots Plaza at the National Cemetery in Sarasota on Nov. 11 each year. Bishop Frank J. Dewane initiated the Catholic Mass in 2010 just a few years after the cemetery opened. The main celebrant and homilist for the Mass was Father Bob Kantor, Pastor of St. Agnes Parish in Naples, State Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, and a retired U.S. Navy Chaplain. John Robinson, a parishioner at St. Thomas More Parish in Sarasota and a combat-wounded U.S. Marine who served during the Korean War, has attended every Catholic Mass on Veterans Day because he feels it is his duty to honor the memory of his comrades in arms.

"I found my faith during war," Robinson said. "I was proud to serve my country and it is wonderful that the Catholic Church recognizes the sacrifice made by our veterans by having this Mass every year."

There are now more than 25,000 veterans and eligible family members currently interred in the National Cemetery and some 18.5 million military veterans in the United States.


MEMBERSHIP WEEKEND-



BALTIMORE ORIOLES SPRING TRAINING SEASON IS FAST APPROACHING-



The 2024 World Series may have just ended last month, but preparations are underway for the Baltimore Orioles 2025 Spring Training Season.

The Orioles will play a 15-game schedule at Ed Smith Stadium. The season begins on Saturday, February 22nd and ends on Friday, March 21st. The schedule includes three games against the Pittsburgh Pirates; two games with the Atlanta Braves, Detroit Tigers, Minnesota Twins and Toronto Blue Jays; and single games with the Boston Red Sox, New York Yankees, Philadelphia Phillies and Tampa Bay Rays. There will be 10 afternoon games starting 1:05 pm and 5 night games starting at 6:05 pm.

For the 14th consecutive year, the St. Thomas More and Incarnation Councils will be working a concession stand together. Charlie Culkin will continue as the Team Director. The Councils will operate the Outdoor Patio Grill, where they have worked the past four years. As of now, the menu will be hamburgers, cheeseburgers, hot dogs and sausage peppers & onions; peanuts, popcorn and chips; and bottled soda and water, Gatorade and draft beer. Like last year, it will take 12 volunteers to operate the concession stand – an average of six volunteers from each Council per game. And like last year, volunteers must make a two-game commitment. Last year, a number of volunteers stepped forward to work multiple jobs. To provide more staffing flexibility, it would be beneficial if a few more volunteers step forward to learn multiple jobs, such as working as a grill assistant or a cashier. There are Brothers who can train you.

In a few days, you will be receiving an email with the "2025 Spring Training Baseball Sign-Up Sheet. You will be asked to indicate what position you would like to work. There is no guarantee that you will work the same position every game. My first scheduling priority is ensuring that I have required volunteers to cover all the positions for every game. For newcomers, you will receive a Baltimore Orioles tee shirt and a Council ball cap.

BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN RESULTS -




