## Grand Knights Report

### THE SEASON OF LENT -

Like Advent, where we prepare for Jesus's birth at Christmas, Lent is also a liturgical season of preparation, as we get ready for Easter—the Church's greatest celebration. And just like our weather seasons have unique characteristics, so too do seasons within the Church.

In contrast to Advent and Easter, Lent is more solemn. The sacrament of reconciliation—where we ask God for forgiveness—becomes more popular. It's a time when Christians and Catholics discover how to confess—and the power of God's forgiveness.

The first day of Lent is always Ash Wednesday, in which we use ashes on our forehead in the shape of a cross to remember our own mortality and begin our journey of penance. Three key pillars characterize the Lenten season: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (charity).

During Lent, “we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting.” Lent includes Palm Sunday, which presents its own unique liturgy, featuring a procession of the congregation into the church along with, of course, the distribution of palms. It is during this service that the entire Passion story is read aloud as we begin Holy Week.

Lent technically ends on Holy Thursday as we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper, remembering Jesus's final meal with his disciples in which he institutes the Eucharist. The next day is Good Friday. Holy Saturday, the day of waiting for the joy of the Resurrection, completes what is known as the Triduum: the three days leading up to Easter Sunday.

## Committee Corner

### **2025 SPRING TRAINING BASEBALL SEASON IS THE MOST SUCCESSFUL EVER -**

For the fourteenth consecutive year, St. Thomas More Council 7826 and Incarnation Council 15332 operated a concession stand at Ed Smith Stadium during the 2025 Baltimore Orioles Spring Training Baseball Season. And for the fifth season, the Councils operated the Outdoor Patio Grill Concession Stand – AND WE DID VERY WELL!!

#### **Operational Results:**

The original schedule called for 15 games, but only 14 were played as one game was a rainout. For those 14 games, Orioles drew 100,516 fans, 7,180 per game. We served 7,099 customers for an average of 507 per game.

The Councils operated a successful concession stand because of the commitment, dedication and hard work of the Brothers and Sisters from St. Thomas More and Incarnation who volunteered to work the stand. St. Thomas More Council provided 28 volunteers – Denny Armstrong, Ken Berberich, Dick Calo, Rob Carver, Scott Deahna, Gary and Margot Ellis, Jon Engel, Millie and Myron Fedecky, Richard Lamb, Kevin Maguire, Tom Maniuszko, Hope Myers, Ralph Neller, Jeff Noccioli, Ray Paleczny, Chris Pariseau, Ed Powers, Mara Linscott Powers, Paul Procopio, Lynn Quartermaine, John Regan, Dan Martin, Jack Rodman, Max Streibel, Mike Vignola, and Dr. Steve and Teresa Wyer.

So what did the Outdoor Patio Grill Concession Stand “grill up? For the 14-game season, Head Chef Dr. Steve Wyer and his great grill staff cooked 4,340 hot dogs, 2,643 hamburgers/cheeseburgers, 1,033 sausages, and 1,083 Philly cheesesteaks – a new item – for a total of 9,099 sandwiches. The busiest game was the New York Yankees – which had an attendance of 8,498 – where the grill staff prepared 966 sandwiches!

Because of the great product cooked and the service provided by the St. Thomas More and Incarnation volunteers, they received many compliments from the fans, stadium employees and Orioles staff. Some fans even wrote the Orioles that the concession stand operated the best stand in the stadium. In fact, we were voted the best concession stand in the Grapefruit League for the third consecutive year.

Finally, the concession stand was successful because of the leadership of Dr. Steve and Teresa Wyer and Incarnation’s Dale Haas. They worked every game and made sure everything went smoothly even when they faced challenges.





## Committee Corner

### 2025 SPRING TRAINING BASEBALL SEASON CON'T-

#### Financial Results:

In a first, the Outdoor Patio Grill generated sales of \$188,026, or \$13,430 per game. After deducting discounts and sales tax, net sales were \$172,600, or \$12,329 per game. The Councils receive 10% of net sales. For the 2025 Spring Training Season, this will amount to \$17,260. In addition, the concession stand received \$18,170 in credit card tips and \$1,321 in cash tips for a total tips of \$19,491, or \$1,392 per game. The bottom line is that the concession stand generated \$36,750 in revenues for the two Councils. After deducting expenses – 5% of credit card tips for commissary workers who provided supplies for the concession stand, Orioles shirts, Council hats, stand supplies and Thank You Cookout costs – each Council should receive around **\$17,500**. The amount is an estimate until the final accounting and check is received from the Baltimore Orioles, which should be around mid-April.



#### Thank You Cookout:

To celebrate all hard work by the St. Thomas and Incarnation Council volunteers, a “Thank You Cookout” is tentatively planned on Thursday, May 1st from 5:30 pm to 8:00 pm. It will be held at the Incarnation Parish Finegan Center parking lot. It is a well-deserved thank you to the volunteers who worked this Spring Training Baseball Season.
